


## HIGHLIGHTS

- **2,698** refugees and migrants arrived: **2,668** from fYRo Macedonia and **30** from Bulgaria.
- **4,164** asylum-seekers departed to Croatia.
- **3,893** asylum seekers were registered on 11 December, **4,298** on 12 December and **3,322** on 13 December, bringing the total for 2015 to **528,477**.



## SOUTH

**2,668** refugees and migrants were assisted at the Miratovac Refugee Aid Point (RAP) upon arrival from fYRo Macedonia. The weather was very cold (-7 C at night).

Afghans, Iraqi and Syrians continued arriving from fYRo Macedonia without problems. UNHCR assisted two persons with disabilities with family members from the "white stone" to Serbian border police check point for onward transport by DRC, MSF and IOM via Blue camp to the Presevo Reception Centre (RC).

UNHCR/DRC, IOM and MSF vans transported five disabled persons and medical cases with their family members from the border to the RC, including a six years old Afghan girl who needs a liver transplant and three elderly in wheelchairs.

220 asylum seekers spent the night in the RAP and over 100 in Tabanovce, waiting for UNHCR-funded buses to take them to the RC in the morning. UNHCR/DRC provided blankets in the RAP.

UNHCR-funded buses took 1,860 asylum-seekers from Miratovac village to the RC.

**3,230** asylum-seekers were registered at the RC in a process that took almost three hours and there were 50 asylum seekers waiting at the RC at the end of reporting period.

UNHCR, SCRMP, Police, the Medical Centre, Red Cross, UNICEF, Caritas, DRC, Natan and Remar assisted asylum seekers 24/7 at the Presevo RC. UNFPA, ADRA, Care international were present during the day. Police, IOM, Philanthropy and Medical Centre assisted 24/7 at Miratovac RAP and for security reasons UNHCR, DRC, MSF, and Humedica assisted until 11:00 pm.

UNHCR/DRC assisted over 70 persons with specific needs (PSN), including a 100-years old Afghan.

UNHCR/DRC distributed 35 boots, 147 UNHCR blankets, 33 socks, 4 winter jackets, 66 bottles of water and 47 boxes of WFP HEB.

145 asylum-seekers frequented medical services inside the RC and the clinics of MSF/Humedica /Natan. UNICEF/DRC/CSW hosted 107 children and 58 mothers in the child friendly space.

## EAST

---

30 Afghan men arrived in Dimitrovgrad. Many needed winter clothes and shoes. The Divac Foundation distributed food, hygiene and clothes.

## BELGRADE

---

At any one time, over 80 refugees and migrants rested in parks and public spaces. They were mainly Afghans, Iraqi and Syrians.

Most of them sought aid in food, clothes and use of Internet. SCRM, UNHCR/DRC, Red Cross, Asylum Info Centre and Mikser were assisting them and providing information.

Novi Beograd Healthcare Centre and UNHCR-funded DRC doctors provided treatment in the park. The Red Cross distributed 180 meals. 25 men from Afghanistan, Iraq, Iran, Nigeria, Sudan and Bangladesh visited the Asylum Info Centre where they received information, charged their phones, used the Internet and took some packages. The Centre distributed 45 chicken pates, 21 hygienic packages and two bags of male clothes.

## WEST

---

4,164 asylum seekers departed to Croatia on four trains.

The weather was cold and foggy, temperature dropped to -2 °C.

UNHCR/HCIT assisted 226 asylum-seekers, including 24 PSN, mainly with boarding and referrals as needed, and distributed 88 UNHCR blankets, 2,316 water bottles, 2,500 WFP HEBs, 100 UNHCR bags, 3 pairs of boots and 129 jackets. The Baptistic Serbian Church (BSC) donated 180 socks and 144 gloves.

WAHA provided medical care to some 100 asylum-seekers, mainly for cold and respiratory infections.

SCRM, UNHCR, Police, APC, the Serbian Red Cross, MSF, BCM, Czech Volunteers, CRS/Divac Foundation, World Vision, TDH, NSHC and OM assisted asylum seekers at Adasevci 24/7.

MSF provided medical services to 228 asylum-seekers, while the UNICEF/WV/CSW child friendly space hosted 174 children and mothers.

CRS/DIVAC distributed 550 food packages, 550 pairs of socks and 24 hygiene kits for women. EHO distributed 500 food packages.

INTERSOS charging/Wi-Fi station provided services to 320 asylum-seekers.
