


**STATISTICS AND HIGHLIGHTS**

- **2,636** refugees and migrants arrived: **2,583** from fYRo Macedonia and **53** from Bulgaria.
- **1,728** asylum seekers departed to Croatia.
- UNHCR is grateful to the Government of Sweden for having quickly accepted for orderly refugee resettlement to Sweden a 13 year old unaccompanied child, who has been cared for by UNHCR and the social protection system of Serbia since he arrived in Serbia over a month ago.


**SOUTH**

**2,583** refugees and migrants were assisted at the Miratovac Refugee Aid Point (RAP) upon arrival from fYRo Macedonia.

Police, Gendarmerie, IOM, Philanthropy, Remar, Medical Center, UNHCR, MSF, DRC, World Vision, were assisting them at the RAP. UNHCR/DRC/SPDE distributed 23 winter boots, 13 jackets, 2 raincoats and 60 water bottles, while UNICEF and Philanthropy/CRS distributed other non-food items (NFIs).

The health clinic inside the RAP treated four patients and UNICEF/DRC hosted 42 children and 13 women in their child friendly space.

UNHCR-funded buses transported approximately 2,280 asylum seekers from Miratovac village to the Reception Centre (RC) in Presevo where they were registered. 12 persons with specific needs (PSNs) were prioritized for registration.

UNHCR, SCRM, Police, Medical Centre, ADRA, Red Cross, IOM, UNICEF/DRC, Caritas, DRC, BCM/CRS and Remar assisted asylum-seekers 24/7 at the RC. Natan, Humedica, Care international/Nexus, SOS Children, OXFAM 484, Global Medic were present during the day. Save the Children, APC, Youth for Refugees, Atina, Border Free, Mercy Corps and MSF were active outside the RC.

UNHCR and partners distributed 88 winter boots, 36 UNHCR blankets, 13 winter jackets, socks and 184 water bottles. Public Doctors, MSF, Humedica and Natan treated 149 asylum seekers. The UNICEF/DRC/CSW child friendly space hosted 135 children and 81 women.

Approximately 300 asylum seekers stayed overnight inside the RC, including 210 in the UNHCR RHUs. 150 stayed outside the RC in MSF and Border Free tents.

## EAST

---

**53** asylum seekers arrived in Dimitrovgrad and Negotin from Bulgaria. Of those, 35 from Iraq and 18 from Afghanistan.

In Dimitrovgrad, UNHCR, Sigma Plus, Red Cross and Divac Foundation distributed food, water, clothes, boots and blankets. DRC, Praxis, I'm Human Organization and Info Park were also present. WAHA provided medical assistance to 12 asylum seekers for minor injuries and respiratory problems.

Amity assisted arrivals in Negotin. Red Cross and ADRA distributed food and clothes.

## BELGRADE

---

Over **260** refugees/migrants were in Belgrade, most from Morocco, Algeria and few from Afghanistan.

Many sought aid in food, clothes, use of internet and referrals to various services, including hospitals and registration. SCRM, UNHCR/DRC, Red Cross, Asylum Info Centre and Refugee Aid Miksalište assisted them. Caritas distributed food and clothes at the park near the railway. Also MSF offered primary health care and distributed NFIs.

## WEST

---

**1,728** refugees departed to Croatia on two trains. 53 were denied boarding by Croatian authorities and placed in the Sid RAP.

IOM established a regular presence in Sid and counselled two migrants on assisted voluntary return to their countries of origin.

At Sid train station, UNHCR/HCIT supported six PSNs to board the train and distributed 60 UNHCR blankets, WFP HEB, 1,212 water bottles, 77 winter jackets, boots, and UNHCR bags. IDC/Sid Health Centre and WAHA treated 37 asylum seekers at the Sid train station.

In Adasevci UNHCR, SCRM, Police, APC, Red Cross Serbia, MSF, CRS/Divac Foundation, BCM, Remar, OM and Czech Volunteers assisted asylum-seekers 24/7; World Vision, Intersos, Caritas, TDH, EHO, DRC and NSHC during the day. Over 150 asylum seekers slept overnight in one heated and fully furnished MSF rub hall.

MSF provided medical assistance to 131 refugees and BCM/Sid Health Centre treated 89. The UNICEF/WV/CSW child friendly space hosted 141 children and 43 mothers.

The Red Cross and Caritas distributed food on buses. Remar offered of hot tea and of soup. CRS/Divac Foundation distributed adult and children's winter clothes and footwear.
