


POPULATION

HIGHLIGHTS

- During the month of June 2,709 individuals arrived in Minawao camp spontaneously; This population consists of refugees who have recently crossed from Nigeria but mainly of refugees who have been out of camps in the border zones and who now realize that the insecurity in their area of origin might last longer
- 76% of the total camp population are under 18 years old
- Cholera prevention plan and rainy season preparedness are ongoing



PRIORITIES

- Find a second site to place all the new arrivals but also decongest the camp and move some residents to the new site
- Improvement of water supply system
- Ensure the inclusion of the profiles of IDP communities in a protection analysis/strategy
- Strengthening of security measures within the camp
- Enrolment of children in primary school
- Improve psycho-social support



Joint UNHCR and Government's protection screening ongoing before registration of new arrivals; sensitization against cultural practices favoring SGBV in refugee, displaced and host communities.



Psychosocial support and referral capacity of district hospital needs to be increased; health staffing to be increased; Cholera prevention activities to be intensified.



Food basket improved during June distribution by adding vegetables; blanket Supplementary Feeding Program activities ongoing



Standards in camp not yet reached; ratio is 16 l/ind/day. Hygiene promotion activities have been increased. Water trucking provides 60% of the water supply.



2,681 family shelters built out of which more than 300 by the refugees themselves; 1,068 family tents and more than 170 community shelters established for over 5,000 refugees.



Only 50% of primary school-aged children are enrolled in school due to lack of classrooms (24 classrooms for 10,000 children), lack of teachers and non-enrolment in country of origin. UNHCR plans to build more schools.



2,795 women and men including from host communities will benefit in 2015 from livelihood activities/vocational training.
