UNHCR operational highlights

- From 16 to 17 August 2013, a joint Government and UNHCR delegation visited refugees from the Central African Republic in Mole camp. Subsequently refugees received food rations for one month.
- There continues to be a steady flow of civilians from the Central African Republic crossing the border in the North and South Ubangi regions of the Equateur Province. UNHCR pre-registered 41,500 individuals from CAR in the Equateur and Oriental Province since March 2013, including some 1,000 new arrivals last week of August. UNHCR has already relocated 11,524 people to 4 camps Mboti (Oriental Province), Mole, Inke and Boyabu (Equatorial Provinces).

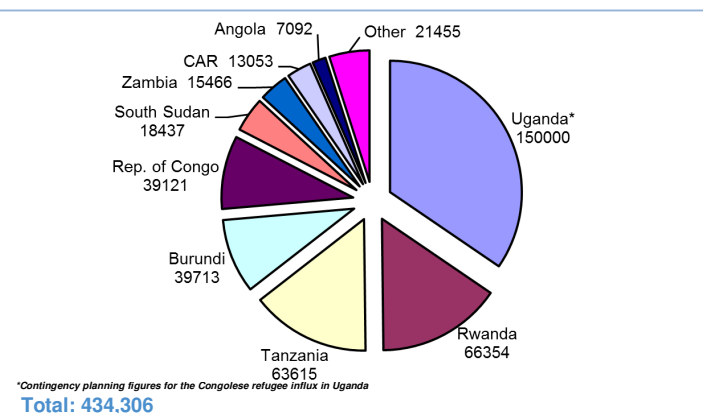

Working with partners

Together with the DRC Government authorities, in particular the National Commission for Refugees (CNR), UNHCR manages and implements humanitarian assistance and protection for refugees, returnees and internally displaced persons. Within the collaborative approach, support is delivered jointly with MONUSCO, WFP, UNICEF, OCHA, UNDP, UNFPA, WHO, FAO and IOM among other agencies and NGOs. UNHCR leads the Protection cluster. UNHCR is also the lead of the Protection and Prevention component of the Comprehensive Strategy to Combating SGBV in DRC, under the STAREC.

In the field, assistance is delivered together with 16 implementing partners: ADSSE, AGIR POUR LE GENRE, AIDES, AIRD, CNR, ERUKIN, FEMISA, GERMAN AGRO-ACTION, GRACE, IEDA, INTERSOS, MDA, MIDEFEHOPF, PU, SFCG and WFWI.

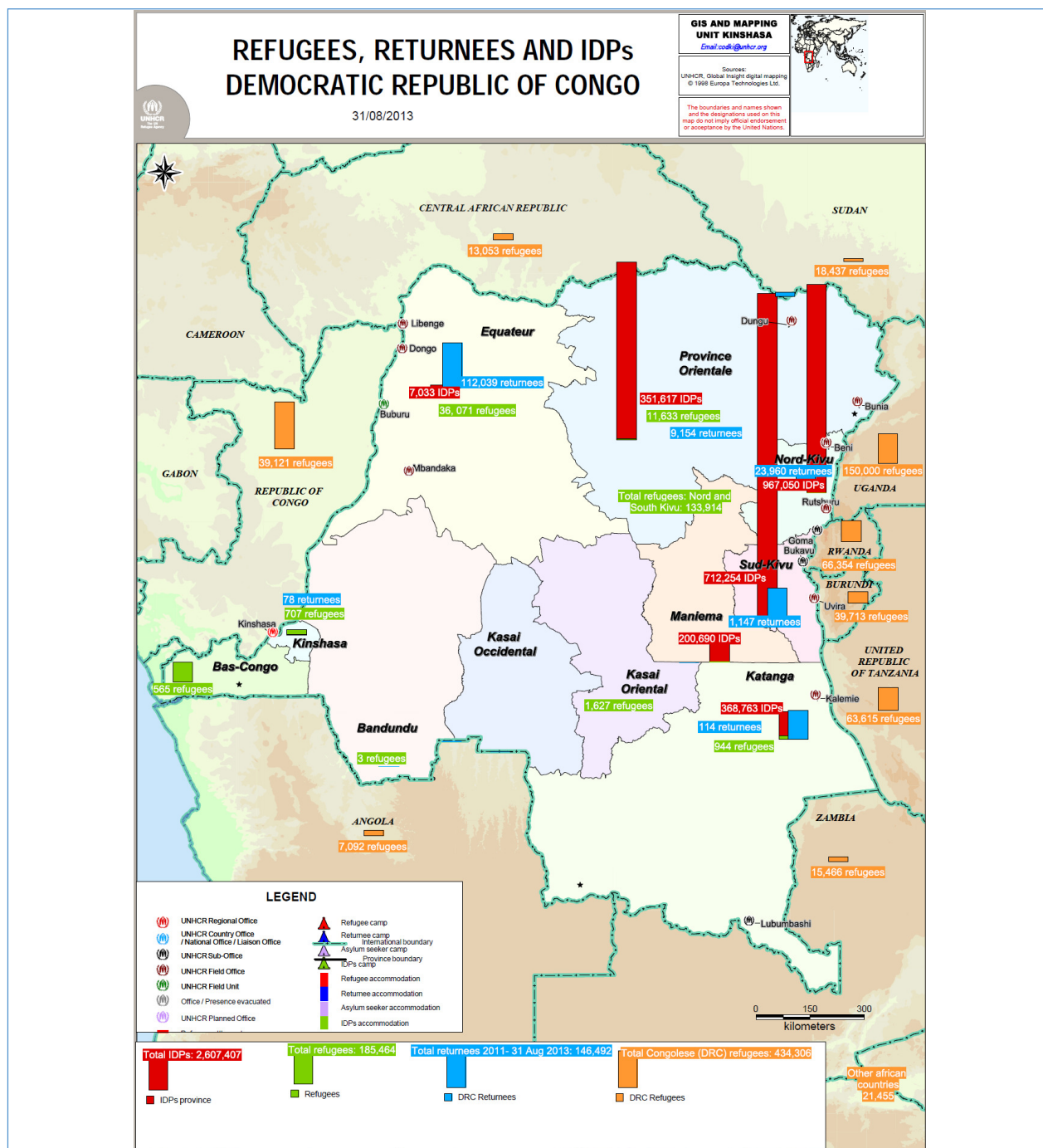

Achievements

- Since January 1st, some **4,333** Rwandan refugees returned to Rwanda from Bukavu and Goma.
- **53,333** DRC refugees returned from Republic of Congo to Equateur Province this year. The voluntary repatriation operation started on 5 May 2012, since then **99,651** individuals returned in Equateur.
- **283** Congolese refugees have been repatriated from Burundi in 2013.
