<p>Updates from the field based working groups</p>	<p>Zaatari camp:</p> <p>Protection Zaatari strategic plan were finalized after compiling all the comments and recommendation from mini groups at the camp and national level protection working group. Consultation with the refugees community is being conducted in order to deliver the final plan to the camp management.</p> <p>IMC is organizing a 4 PSS trainings funded by UNICEF on activities to CP actors starting the 7th of July, each training will be for 5 days, two training will be in July and 2 will be in August.</p> <p>Child Labor Taskforce: The last meeting was before Eid holidays. Organization that attended were IMC, NRC, NHF and UNHCR. The next meeting will be announced soon for both Zaatari level and National level (Will be conducted at ILO).</p> <p>Inter-Agency Child Labor Expert:International consultant who is deployed by MoSD with UNICEF's technical support arrived in Amman. His focus will be on children found working or begging on the streets. He will support MoSD in understanding the scope of the problem and for this a survey will be conducted. He will also support</p>	<p>Brief presentation and work plan to be presented next meeting.</p>	

	<p>MoSD in the following :</p> <p>Develop short, medium and long-term strategies and action plan for prevention of begging and working by children on streets as well as for provision of services to already found begging and working children.</p> <p>Provide recommendations to the ministry on the support to these vulnerable children and families using the capacities if existing social support services as well as taken into consideration the financial resources of the ministry. ☒</p> <p>Prepare and share with the ministry an evidence based report of best existing practices on socio-economic empowerment of former street and working children and their families looking at them individually in the street, at the Drop in Centres, in their family set-up and in the communities that can be applied in Jordan context.</p> <p>Prepare a strategy/recommendations on ways forward for a larger scale interventions design for Jordan for combatting/prevention child labour and begging by children. The executive plan of the strategy should be clear on the needed financial commitments as well as roles/responsibilities of MoSD as well as other key partners/concerned ministries.</p> <p>Consultant will be getting in touch with the members of CPWG shortly for key informant interviews.</p> <p>It is expected that the consultant will attend the CPWG meeting in August and brief the forum on the progress made.</p>		
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<p>Updates on the roll out of CPIMIS+/PRIMERO by IMC</p>	<p>IMC updated members on the new CPIMIS+ system new version that have been finalized through Organizations that conduct child protection case management and a mission came from UNICEF HQ had a 2 weeks workshop to finalize the CPIMIS+ that will replace the CPIMIS that is currently used for CP cases.</p> <p>The new CPIMIS+ is a web based system, the system will be tested for the next 6 months in order to ensure full efficiency to replace the current standalone CPIMIS system where every case manager download the software on their computer.</p> <p>The CPIMIS+ will make the collection and reporting of data easier, the forms and SOPs were digitalized.</p>		
<p>Presentation by INTERSOS on child labor assessment in ITs</p>	<p>INTERsos gave a brief presentation on the child labor assessment took place in 13 ITs (8 in Ramtha and 5 in Jordan Valley) with 190 children. The data collection was conducted in Makani centers through PSS activities.</p> <p>The purpose of the assessment to provide accurate evidences of the existence of child labor in 13 ITs of Irbid governorate, where Syrian refugee communities reside; Shed light on the forms of child labor that are practiced in ITs, and if worst forms of child labor exist and Advocate for more humanitarian focus on the issue of child labour in ITs, which needs attention from both the donors and the (I)NGOs community, given the devastating consequences on children and their families.</p> <p>The tools used were desk reviews and ad hoc meetings, structured PSS activities, observations in working field and semi structured interviews with community members/leaders and landowners/farmers and "shawish"</p> <p>Main findings were shared with members regarding how do they work and why, formal education analysis and security and safety.</p>	<p>INTERsos presentation to be circulated with CPSWG members.</p>	

	<p>Conclusions and Recommendations were explained to members for best practices.</p>		
<p>Review progress against core child protection indicators</p>	<p>Sector coordinator presented an extraction of the data that was reported on ActivityInfo for the CP key indicators (Progress against the Target). The critical gaps were highlighted especially in the sensitization and training interventions were partners that are not reporting shall report on regular basis for those indicators.</p> <p>Protection Coordination Associate briefed members on the Data Quality exercise that was conducted in June, the importance of reporting were discussed as it is one of the goals of the Inter-Agency Coordination Unit. The purpose of the exercise is to improve the quality of the data reported and increase awareness for partners on reporting mistakes. CP/ESWG mapping update	Sector Coordinator presented the matrix of the mapping that will be used in the mapping exercise that was implemented jointly with the ESWG. The matrix is covering all the areas in Jordan and list of the activities implemented, Sector coordinator explained the document walking through every column in order for partners to be able to utilize it.

The JRP Secretariat informed that the JORISS reporting system for the first half of 2016 (1 January to 30 June 2016) was opened on 1 July, requesting all JORISS users to complete their project reporting by 21 July.
