



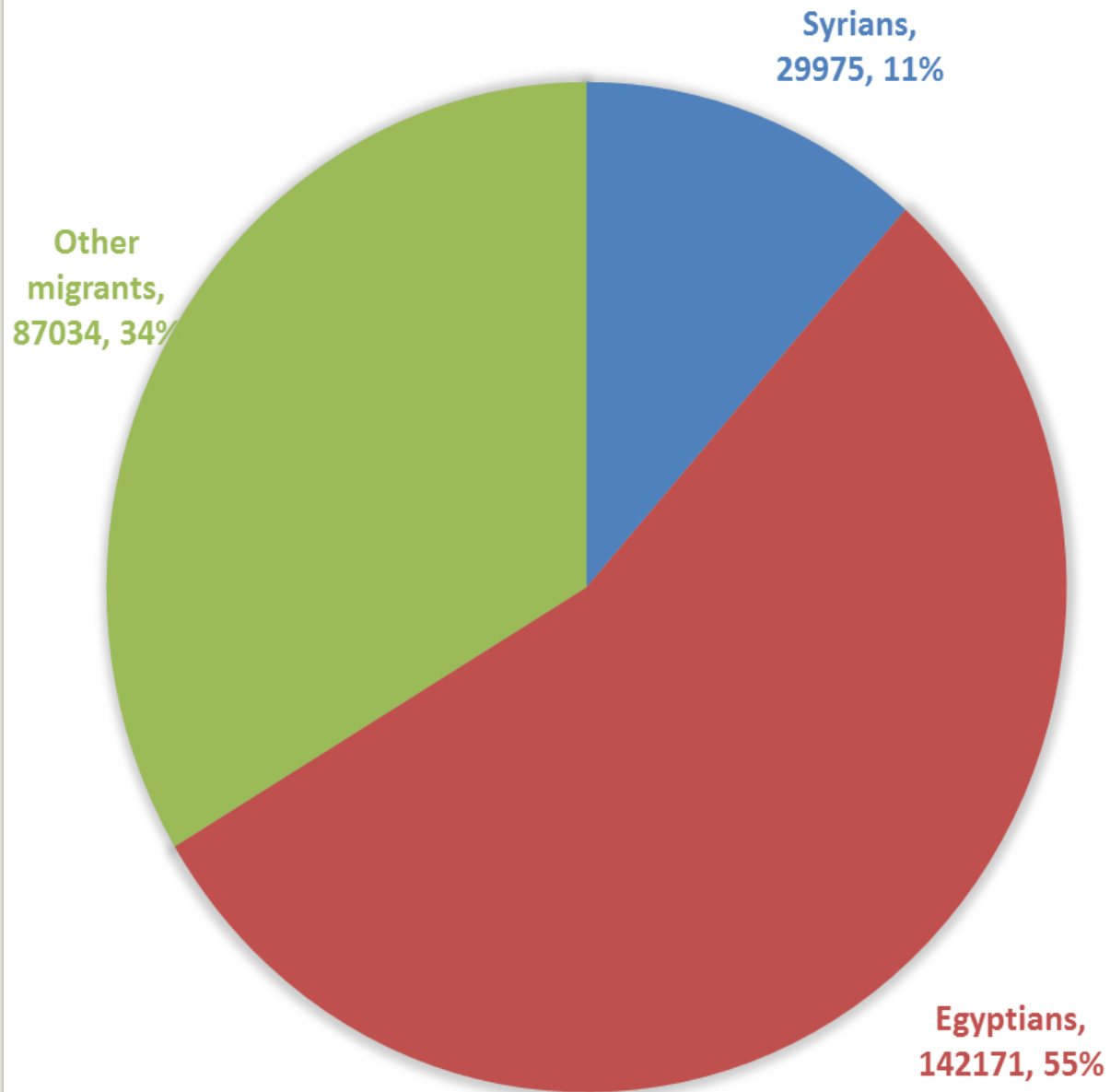

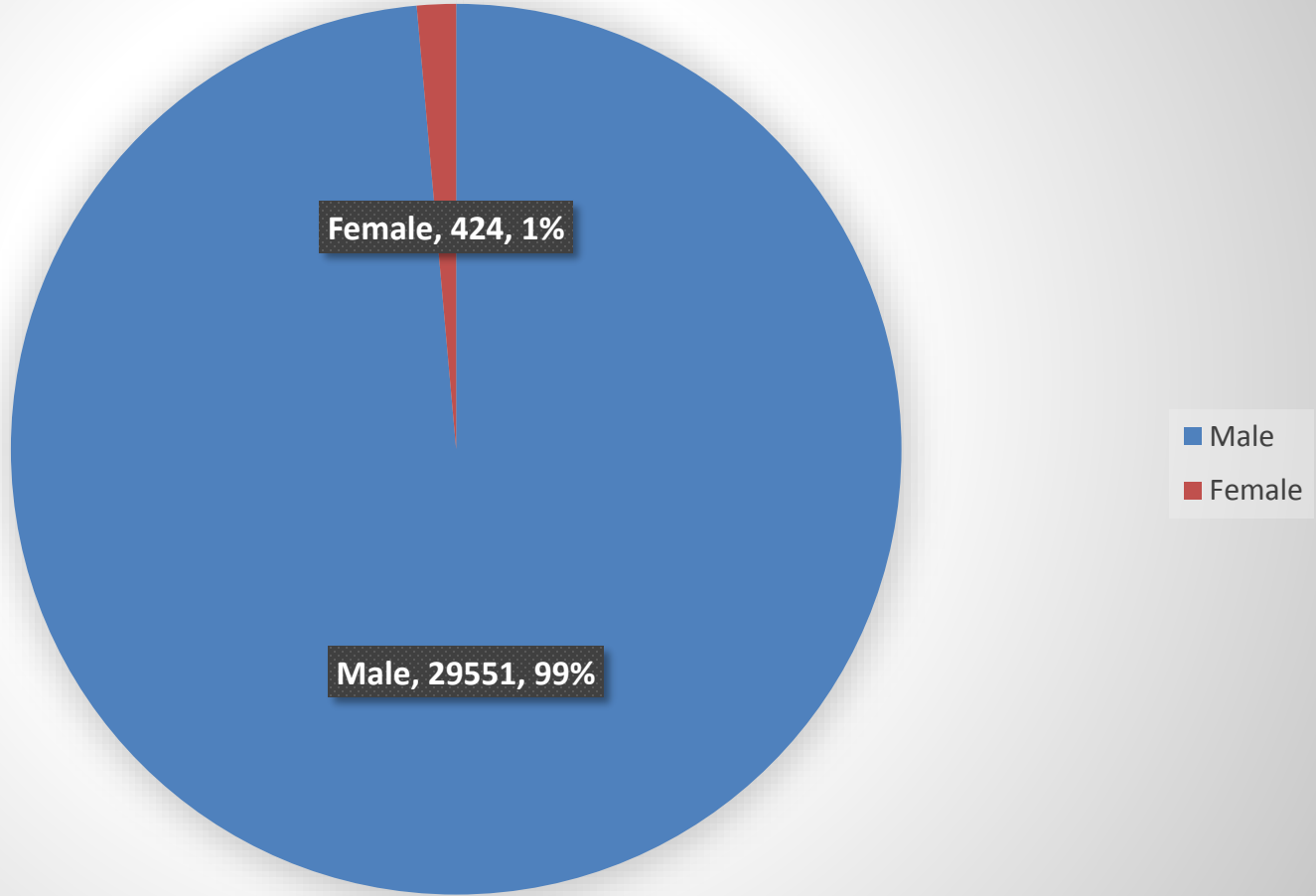


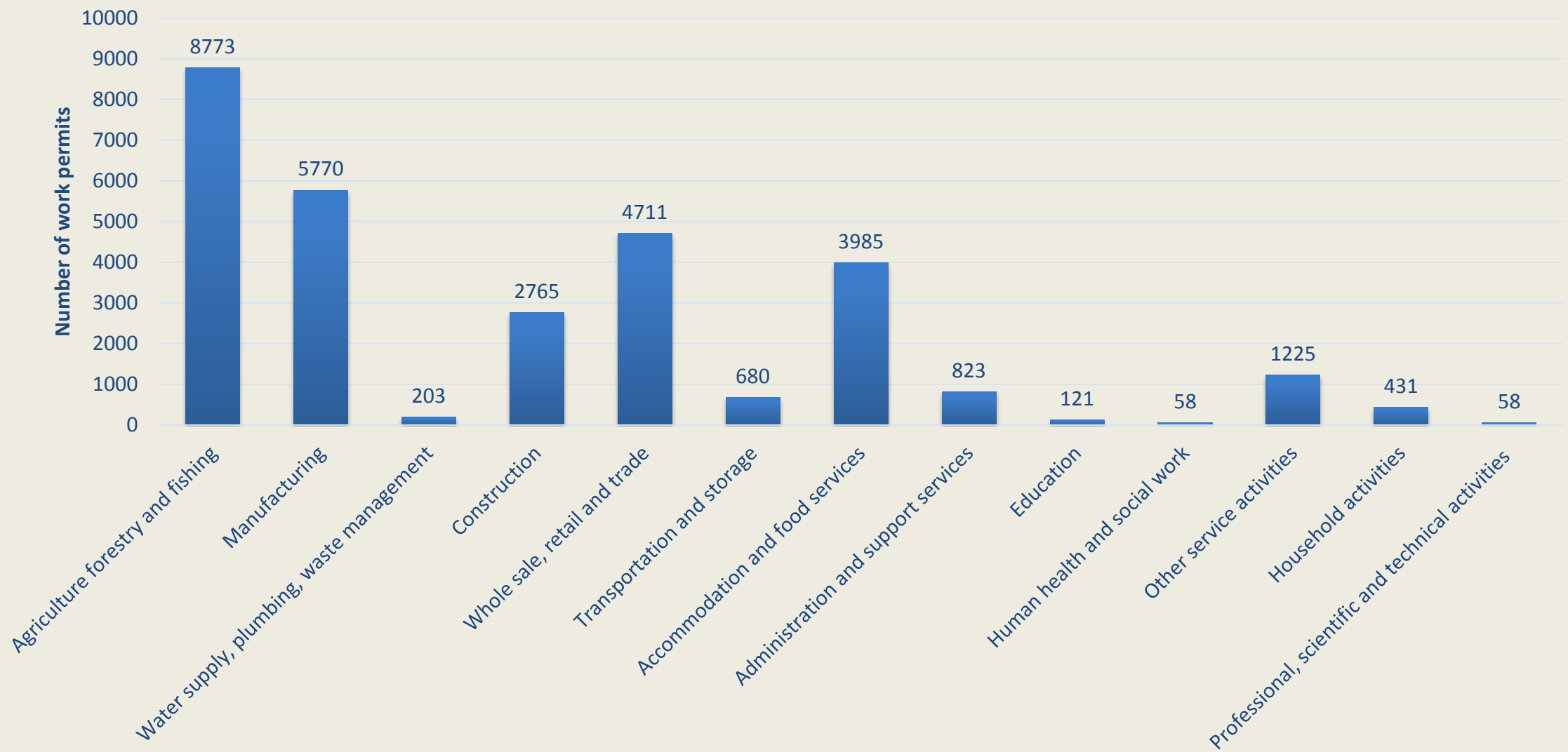
## Share of Syrians among migrant workers having received a work permit

On 06 October 2016, Jordan has:

- 259,000 legally registered foreign workers, the majority (55% per cent) of them Egyptians.
- 34% from Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, the Philippines and India.
- 29,975 (11% ) are Syrians comparing to 2% before London conference Feb 2016.

# Percentage of Work Permits issued to Syrian workers, By Gender

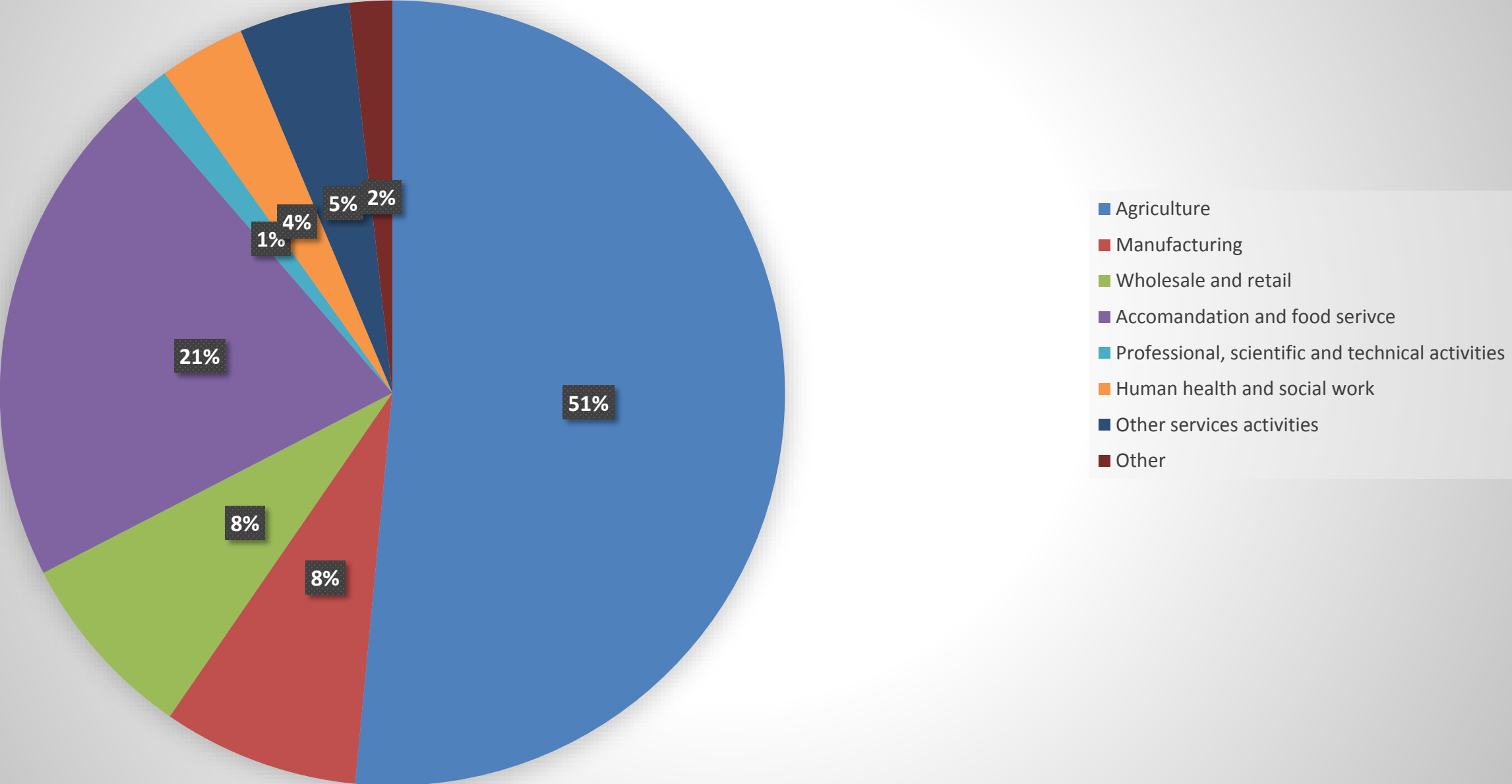




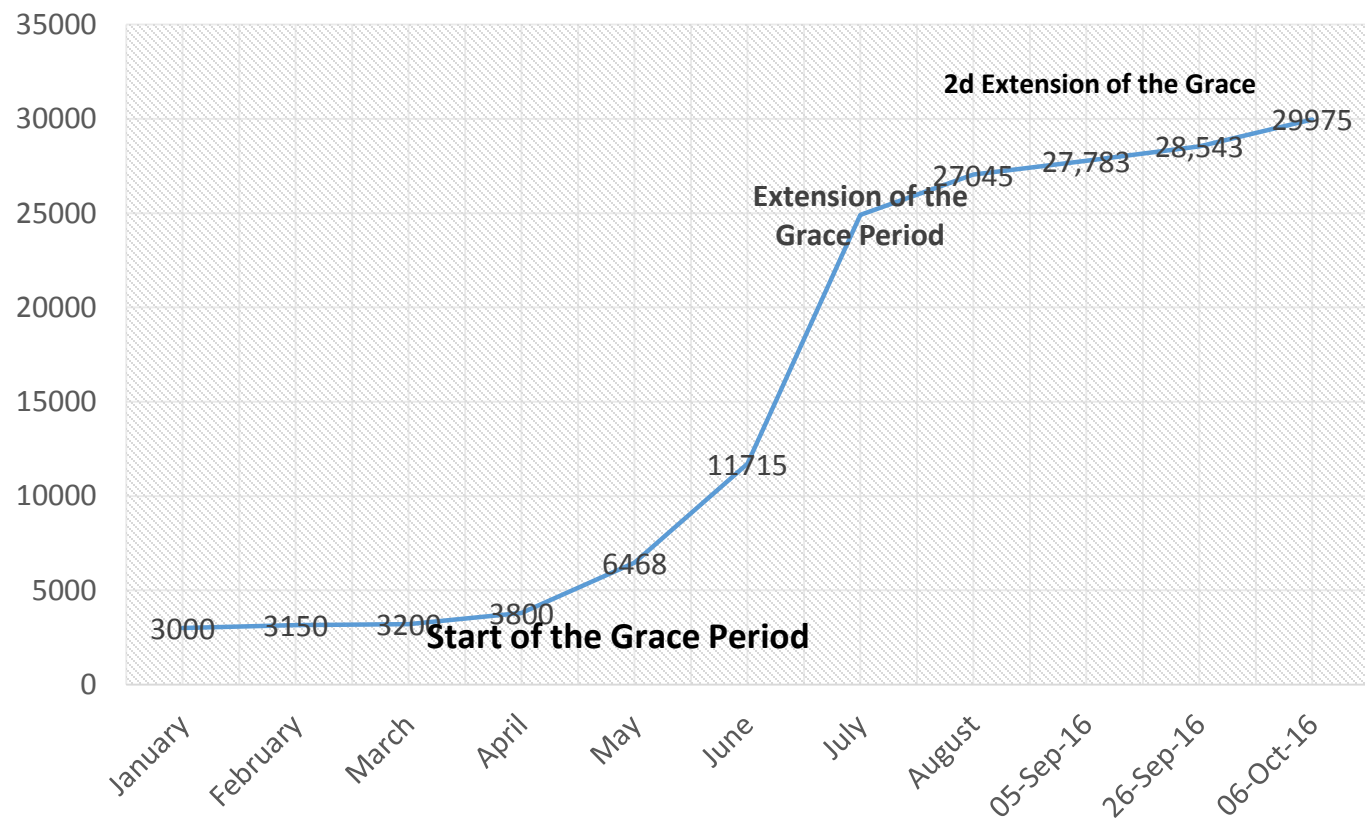
Number of Work Permits issued to Syrian workers, by Economic Activity

# Working permits – towards 200,000



- Ministry of Labour actively seeking ways to increase number of Syrians with working permits
- Grace period of 3 months (April -July) for fees and no deportation of illegal workers to camps.
- Extension of the Grace period for additional three months July-October
- Working permits in agriculture de-linked from employers & active campaign with Cooperatives supported by ILO.
- Extension of the Grace period till end of 2016
- 22 September 2016, the exemption of the medical check up for Syrians holding MOI card
