<b>Reusable sanitary pads Presentation</b>	<p>A presentation about “Reusable sanitary pads” has been shared with the present partners of the WASH working group. The Safepad™ is a reusable sanitary pad designed to provide a safe and infection free experience. The pads are designed with a permanently bonded antimicrobial technology that helps reducing vaginal infections by removing yeast and bacteria during use and care. Safepad™, will sterilize itself after soaking and rinsing. The cost for one package with four pads is less than \$4. It will last for 100 cycles of soaking / rinsing.</p> <p>It was suggested to run a pilot by ACF, ACTED, JEN and Oxfam and supervised by Roelof (WV), Eva (UNHCR) and Hanin (RHAS) at the camp for six months. Torben from REAL RELIEF will be visiting Jordan in December 2016. 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<b>Water &amp; Sanitation for the Urban Poor WSUP Presentation</b>	<p>A presentation about “Water Programming in the MENA Region” UNICEF/IIED/WSUP Research Study has been shared with the present partners of the WASH working group. The research was about “To what extent have service providers been able to respond to changes in water demand and/or disruption to supply systems resulting from crises in the MENA region?”.</p> <p>After the meeting a side discussions took place with some partners of the WASH WG. <b>JRP 2017-2019</b>	<p>Thanks goes to the WASH TF members who attended the JRP 2017-2019 Workshop held in Dead Sea on 4-6 October in terms of finalising the WASH Sector JRP documents (CVA, SVA, Sector Response Plan and Projects Summary Sheet PSS for Refugee and Resilience). And thanks goes to all partners for submitting the PSS.</p> <p>The PSS summary for Refugees was shared with the present partners of the WASH working group. One of the core modifications in the indicators was the sector specific objectives indicators in terms of number of people who has access to safe water to be the ratio of litre per person per day of safe water delivered to girls, boys, women and men in camps rather than the number of population which is not reflecting the reality. Our target is 35 litres per person per day. And it has sub-indicators which are the Number of people and Number of litres distributed. The targets to reports against is shared to the group.</p> <p>Partners IM focal points will be working closely to ensure that indicators are aligned with the partner’s Project.</p> <p>The JRP documents should be finalised and submitted to the government on 20th October. The final JRP documents will be shared with the WASH WG after submission.</p> <p>For Jordan Response Information System for the Syria Crisis (JORISS), it will be a discussion with MOPIC to enhance the JORISS system, in terms of having a unified portal that allow all partners to report on as a monitoring tool.</p> <p>Laith (UNICEF) will be the focal point for JORISS, and Maysa (UNHCR) will be the focal point for the 3RP. 3RP time table will be shared with the partners.</p>	<p>Esmaeil (UNICEF)</p> <p>Laith (UNICEF)</p> <p>Esmaeil (UNICEF)</p>	12 min
UNICEF updates (Planning exercise)	<p><b>Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs):</b> Esmaeil (UNICEF) will be attending the Country writing group for the Strategic development goals on behalf of the UN agency and the WASH Sector. The SDGs are 17 goals, WASH has one goal (goal no 6), it has 11 indicators and 6 activities. SDGs document will be shared with the WG.</p> <p><b>The United Nations Development Assistance Framework (UNDAF):</b> UNICEF has joined a group of UN agencies, to work on a country assessment. The UN agencies are UNICEF, UNDP, UN Habitat, WHO and WFP.</p> <p>It’s an exercise, doing every five years, now working on the situation analysis. The WASH WG chairs suggested to change the position of MC as the representative for this TF in order to have an active representative who can representing and updating the WG about the WASH activities and news and vis versa at ministry level. The present partners; JEN, ICMC, UN Habitat, Oxfam, ACTED and WV agreed on that.
