1. Presentation

UNHCR and DRC welcomed the participants and introduced the main objectives of the meeting especially for participants who joined for the first time.

Some of the participants provided updates on their organizations' current services, while the new INGOs/NGOs who joined for the first time the Amman referral coordination meeting presented their current services in the different geographical locations:

- INTERSOS
They provide PSS and informal education through CBOs in Irbid and Karak, also they provide the same services in the tents. They also have a new project to provide cash for protection for Syrian refugees and Jordanians, in Karak, Irbid and Amman.
- IFH/NHF
They have provided 650 children with special needs services. In Azraq camp they provide eye glasses and hearing aid for Syrian refugees, case management and PSS as well.

- IOCC
In the current project they will provide services to people with special needs, in Irbid, Amman and Balqa. In October they will conduct assessment to distribute mobility aid for the people who need it. They also provide cash for rent and working on shelter rehabilitation as well.
- PCRf:
They cover the expenses of the medical services/surgeries for children under 18 years regardless of the nationality and according to their criteria. PCRf have small projects to provide eye glasses, mobility aid as well. Currently they have winterization projects to target Syrian refugees.
- MEDAIR
They provide PSS and cash for delivery/health in Amman and Zarqa. Currently, they work on livelihood project in Irbid to target Jordanians.
- DRC
Rehabilitation of Nuzha Community Center is completed and the official opening on 19th Oct. 2016. DRC remain providing the same services and activities in Mahatta Community Center. Rehabilitation of DRC's Livelihood center is completed in village 6 and the opening in October 2016, and providing trainings courses in sewing and tailoring in the camp as well. Necessary rehabilitation has been completed in the youth center at Princess Basma center in Maan. DRC provided 100 Syrian and Jordanian families with JOD 500 (for each family) as "small business grants" in Karak and Maan.

3.. Presentations

** Presentation by Medecins Sans Frontieres:*

MSFF is operating now from AlMuwasa Hospital in Markak Shamaliya. The Amman project is focusing on the victims of violence related to the ongoing crisis (war, epidemics). They provide medical services/surgeries to injured persons, from Syria, Libya, Iraq, Ghaza, etc. such as Orthopaedic, Plastic/reconstructive surgeries and the maxillofacial surgeries. They do provide also Physiotherapy for the persons injured during the war and they have rehabilitation center inside and outside the hospital.

During the presentation, MSFF distributed to participants their table of criteria for admission, the medical assessment form and the referral form.
