<p>Update from task forced and field working group:</p>	<p>Zaatari Camp:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Zaatari Child Protection WG are currently working on the Violence outside of school campaign, a campaign for awareness and protection for children on their way to schools. UNHCR, UNICEF, FPD, Community Police, IRD, Save, IMC and Questscope. • Zaatari camp is in the process to perform a new safety audit. <p>Irbid Coordination:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • MECCI is currently co-chairing the Irbid Coordination Group. <p>CPIMIS TF:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • IRC and IMC will start using CPIMS+ (Web based case management tool) beginning Thursday the 8th of December that will improve the way case management is conducted, improve data collection and reporting. <p>Organizations that are participating in the CP SWG and performing in case management cannot use the tool unless they choose a system and sign information sharing protocols and endorse the SOPs.</p>	<p>Orgs that wants to start conducting case management and CPIMS to contact sector coordinators to sign the information sharing protocol.</p>	

	<p>BERM:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UNICEF succeeded in completing children winter clothes distribution in Hadalat of a total 2400 children received assistance. <p>MOI Service Card issuance:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • As of end of November, a total of 403,000 cards issued so far, 375,000 individuals are registered with UNHCR. 		
<p>KHF joint research with Dundee University:</p>	<p>King Hussein Foundation presented the finding of their joint research with Dundee University on the involvement and leadership of young people in articulating their experience of growing up in situations of displacement and protracted crisis.</p> <p>The research addressed the lack of knowledge of the impacts and outcomes for youth growing up in protracted crises to improve the efficacy of policy and the targeting of multisector programming for young people. Through an in-depth qualitative examination of lived realities and transitions to adulthood among displaced youth in Uganda and Jordan, the research provided an overview of the diversity of experiences as well as in-depth case studies that map out the processes, impacts and outcomes for youth (disaggregated by age and gender).</p> <p>The research innovatively employed the capabilities of young people to undertake their own research and knowledge exchange through a youth-led methodology and engage with communities of policy and practice regarding the impacts of protracted crises on young</p>		

	people's ability to access key transitions including through education, employment and establishing family life at the right time.		
3RP/JRP updates:	<p>JRP project summary sheets is still under review by MoPIC, a budget reduction have been requested from the overall Social Protection budget. Reduction have been managed without effecting partner's appeals. The Inter-Agency Appeal. Inter-Agency Coordination Unit and sector coordinators advocacy continue with MoPIC to prevent further reduction on Protection core projects.</p> <p>If further reductions is requested, partners might be contacted to reduce their appeals.</p>		
Brief on the Best Interest Determination (BID) SOPs	Best Interest Determination SOPs have been finally formally approved as a product of the CP SWG by the UASC TF. The BID SOPs was developed by the BID panel leader UNHCR and CP SWG members that will be applied countrywide. Sector coordinator gave a brief presentation on the SOPs that will be helpful for case managers that receive UASC cases. SOPs are under national and international standards. The BID SOPs will be printed out by the next meeting, shared with members and uploaded on the portal.		
Presentation Makani updates:	Sector Coordinator gave a brief presentation about Makani Centers by UNICEF, to expand learning opportunities for out of school vulnerable children and youth; and respond to the urgent needs of vulnerable Syrian and Jordanian children, adolescents and their families.		

	<p>Makani Centers Learning Support, Psychosocial and Life support services targeting children and youth.</p> <p>UNICEF has 248 Makani centers spreader all over Jordan, trying to cover the most vulnerable locations.</p> <p>UNICEF highlighted the need for Makani centers, an overall view about the services and the monitoring/reporting mechanism that they follow through M&E system such as ActivityInfo and www.Bayanati.org, based on their SOPs and pre/post assessment tools.</p> <p>Sector Coordinator highlighted the achievements that Makani succeeded to achieve, how the monitoring and reporting is done.</p> <p>Pending challenges were mentioned, that UNICEF and CP SWG are working progress to fill those gaps.</p>
