




HIGHLIGHTS


In the first quarter of 2017, 15 Basic Needs partners reached over one million refugees in Turkey with services and assistance.* A total of 620,409 people across the country received monthly cash-based assistance, in addition to 245,948 people receiving one-time cash assistance to enable them to purchase the necessities to endure the cold winter months. A further 193,495 households received core relief items in kind. Through the Basic Needs Working Group (BNWG), partners are planning to exchange experience acquired and lessons learned through their respective winterization programmes to inform a strengthened 2017/18 campaign.

While 35,000 people in camps were provided with assistance to access adequate shelter in January and February alone, Basic Needs actors recognize the urgent need to step up delivery of shelter and WASH assistance to refugees living outside camps. Indeed, shelter is considered a priority need among refugees, particularly in southeastern Turkey, with reports of many families occupying crowded and/or substandard dwellings due to a lack of resources and scarcity of available, appropriate and affordable housing. To inform advocacy and programming, an inter-agency data collection initiative is now underway to gather further information on refugees' household types and conditions.




COUNTRY COVERAGE
