<b>CCCM</b> Agency – RSG, UNHCR, LWF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>LWF facilitated regular CMC meeting on 10th June and participated by 27 (female-9) participants from CMC, Social groups and camp based committees and discussed on camp level issues - NFI, health, livelihood, shelter and water supply and Education and hygiene kits.</li><li>Inter-agency meeting was held on 29th June and participated by 31 (10 Women) representatives from CMC, YDG, CDG, WDG and LWF and discussed on health services, water supply and shelter concerns.</li><li>Diaconia ECCB visitors Mr. Jan Dus and Ms. Petra visited the camp and interact with CMC and WDG about camp issues on 29<sup>th</sup> June.</li><li>12 (5 girls) new baby born and 1 man died in Sittwe General Hospital.</li><li>CCCM supported to CMC on camp management issues during the month.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Shelter repair, walkway improvement, CMC block renovation, jetty construction were the concerns of CMC/IDP.</li><li>CMC requested to provide cooking fuel every month.</li><li>Bad weather and frequent rumour against agencies staffs were minimized the movement in the camp.</li></ul>

<b>Food and Nutrition</b> Agency – SCI and ACF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• SCI distributed Rice, Bean, Salt and Oil to 1159 families with 4280 populations on 6th June. This month blended food was not distributed.</li> <li>• CMC requested to provide food ration at beginning of the month.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CMC requested to food for additional 450 families who are not receiving ration since beginning and came from Nget Chaung, Ohn Taw Gyi South.</li> </ul>
<b>Health</b> Agency – MHAA, MSF, MOH	<p>MHAA is providing health services as below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Monday and Friday (2 days/week) - 9:00 am to 12:00 pm.</li> <li>• Some IDPs suffered from diarrhoea and muscle pain.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• IDPs requested to increase service time and days.</li> <li>• CMC requested to establish clinic in the camp.</li> </ul>
<b>NFIs</b> Agency: UNHCR, ICRC	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• ICRC provided 2 mosquito nets on 2nd June and 2 fuel bags on 29th June for each family.</li> <li>• ICRC supplied cooking coal 2 bag/family on June 29</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CMC/WDG requested to provide touch lights, and buckets.</li> </ul>
<b>Shelter and camp infrastructure</b> Agency – RSG, UNHCR, LWF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 97 long houses and 776 rooms constructed in the beginning in the camp.</li> <li>• 9 shelters were totally collapsed, and over 300 rooms are totally damaged. The families of collapsed shelters are living in makeshifts, modular house and small hut (made from collapsed shelter materials)</li> <li>• 1154 families are in the camp.</li> <li>• LWF awarded a tender to supply shelter maintenance material to repair 530 rooms.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• About 450 families are using kitchen rooms and makeshifts as shelter since long time.</li> <li>• CMC and IDPs requested to renovate all damaged rooms and collapsed shelters.</li> </ul>
<b>WASH</b> Agency - SI	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 200 latrines are in the camp but most of them are not functional due to partial damage (pipe, wall, and cup)</li> <li>• Distributed 1248 hygiene kits on 29 June.</li> <li>• Regular daily WASH Promotion activities through HH visit and health promotion sessions.</li> <li>• Latrine repairing is in progress.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CMC request for drain cover because very danger for children in rainy season.</li> <li>• CMC and IDP women are request to provide water bucket to store water.</li> </ul>
<b>Protection and Community Service (LWF)</b> Agency - DRC, SCI	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Indoor recreational events (creative writing, beauty care and art competition) were organized in the camp on 30 June and participated and enjoyed by 90 children and youth participants.</li> <li>• Supplied weekly newspaper regularly and increased access on information.</li> <li>• SCI is supporting 2 Child Friendly Spaces.</li> <li>• Facilitates to social groups to organize their regular meeting.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CMC and Social groups requested to support livelihood activities – livestock rearing, tailoring, home gardening etc.</li> <li>• LWF will assess and support some livelihood activities.</li> </ul>
<b>Fire safety and DRR</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 4 fire points and 20 (5 Females) fire safety volunteers equipment are not in place due to carelessness/damage or misused by community.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Fire safety mass education equipment – hand mike set</li> </ul>
