| Camp coordination and Camp Management | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 3 CMC leaders attended meeting organized by Township Administration Office at Hmanzi junction and shared concerns and situation of the camp. CMC meeting held on 14th January and was participated by 36 (14 females) participants from CMC, WDG, YDG, CDG and other camp based committees. Conducted camp level Inter-agency coordination meeting on 28th January. 30 (16 Female) representatives from CMC, CDN, Mercy Malaysia, Community Service, EiE and CCCM staff participated and discussed on camp activities and issues. LWF installed 3 billboards of CRM in order to raise the awareness of the mechanism of the complaints to the IDPs. There are 11 (7 girls) babies born during the month. Government provided 2 wheeler vehicles to CMC to serve camp population for school transportation and hospital or medical attention purposes. In addition, government provided MMK 100,000 for maintenance purpose. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In CMC meeting, participation from camp based social groups and camp based committees observed increasing. In camp based inter agency meeting, participation from government and agencies and created future scope of collaboration. Mobile for communication to CMC office provided by the government is out of order. The camp leader request to CCCM/LWF to replace. |
| Education | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> LWF completed 2 existing TLSs repair/renovation and 2 new TLSs construction work for primary education (1-5 Grade). As previous month report 642 students from camp are continuing their study from Grade 1 to 5. LWF recruited 10 incentive teachers and trained at Thet Kya Pyin School. The total number of community teachers is 16. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> CMCs requested to build the Middle School (B.E.M.S) at Hmanzi junction. Teachers request to provide school's furniture and first aid kits. 35 students of middle and high school are attending B.E.H.S at Thet Kya Pyin. Parents getting difficulties to afford school transportation costs for children. |

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| Food | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CDN provided food ration which include rice, salt, bean 262 Households, 1,347 IDPs on 29th January. • CDN informed that it will increase the registration of lactating woman and pregnant woman based on survey report and update entitlement list. • CDN informed that they will initiate the process to include 11 families for food entitlement list. However, they could not guarantee to get the approval from WFP and government. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CMC requested to provide the food the first week of the month. IDPs have repeatedly asked for cooking fuel. 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| Health | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • About 55 patients were visited to the mobile clinic almost every weekday. Most of the patients suffer flu, cold and cough because of heavy dust. CMC meeting held on 21st January and discuss to review of ToR of CMC. It is observed that some of CMC members that is appointed by the government resigned citing lack of time. Conducted camp level Inter-agency coordination meeting on 29th January where 34 (11 Female) representatives from CMC, CDN, IRC, Community Service, EiE and CCCM from LWF participated and discussed on camp activities and issues. Government provided 2 wheelers to CMC to serve IDPs for school transportation and medical attention purposes. Government provided MMK 100,000 for maintenance purpose. During the month 4 children (3 Female) born. One adult male died due to dengue fever. About 2 complaint letters have received through CRM boxes and basically they are request to provide furniture for TLS. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Participation of social groups and camp based committees in CMC meeting need to retain and increase to discuss on entire IDP camp issue and increase ownership in camp management. Participation of service provider and government representative in camp level inter agency meeting realized effectively by all stakeholders. Hence expected continuation for further efforts to improve their meaningful participation. Due to heavy dust, most camp residents, especially the children suffered running nose and cough during the winter season. |

When the emergency happens, IRC is assisting to hospitalize in Thae Kay Pyin Hospital by providing transportation charges. Around 65 patients are visiting health clinic weekly. Especially children and elderly suffered by flu and cough. It is reported that there is no IDPs who suffer HIV positive. IRC have a plan to train at least two volunteers from KDK 2 with safe delivery skill and care for pregnant women.
