<b>CCCM</b> Agency – RSG, UNHCR and LWF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>During the month LWF and CMC installed bill boards with information of service providers and effective camp management. Similarly repaired CMC block, provided stationaries and furniture for smooth CMC operation and provide CMC services to camp dwellers.</li><li>A regular CMC meeting was held on 13th October. The meeting was participated by 35 (17 Female) CMC members, representatives from camp based committees (Food Management Committee-FMC) and Women Development Group-WDG).</li><li>LWF provided 35 sets of visibility kit (umbrellas and shoes) for CMC and Incentive Worker in 13th October.</li><li>UNOCHA visited the camp in 22nd October.</li><li>Camp level Inter-Agency (IA) Meeting was attended by 35 (13 Females) representatives from CMC, Health Department, SCI, CDN, FMC, WDG, Youth Development Group-YDG), Leader of Host Community and LWF on 26th October. Service provided by the agencies was reviewed, camp issues were discussed and upcoming plan for September was shared during the meeting.</li><li>LWF facilitate CMC and Incentive Worker capacity building training with aiming to strengthen participatory planning process and participated by 35 (19 women) in 29th October.</li><li>Population and activity dash boards were updated for the month. Reported 1 man passed away.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Regarding to address field issues, LWF realized a regular meeting between camp service providers and CMA.</li></ul>

Two NFE centres with 6 (3 women) NFE Facilitators supported by LWF is operating regularly and a total of participants are 127 (53 Women) people from IDPs and host community children.</li> <li>• Department of Education and SCI facilitate grade 5 examination for 56 (20 girls) students.</li> <li>• LWF provided 3 blackboards for NFE centre on 19th October.</li> <li>• SCI conducted parent teacher association (PTA) meeting on 21st October.</li> <li>• Education Department provided MMK 2,500,000 for 8 primary teachers on 25<sup>th</sup> October.</li> <li>• SCI conducted excel part 3 training in Thet Kay Pyin for TLS teacher in October 2015.</li> </ul>									
<b>Food and nutrition Agency</b> – CDN, WFP	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• SCI conducted a nutrition food cooking demonstration for 20 women on 7th October.</li> <li>• Host community leader informed that RRD provided 200 bag cooking fuel on 5th October.</li> <li>• 1790 population of 395 families received food ration (Rice, pales, salt, oil and Blended food) for a month. However, there are 2,064 people of 410 HHs are living since long time.</li> <li>• CDN had monitoring for food items in 26th October.</li> <li>• CDN facilitate capacity building training participate by 10 mans in 29th October.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Actual population and food entitled population are different and entitlement list is not updating since long time. So new born and some families are not receiving food ration.</li> <li>• CMC requested to provide monthly food ration within first week of month..</li> </ul>

LWF assessed and prepared estimate. 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<b>WASH</b> Agency - SCI	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• SCI provided WASH services during the month and monitored toilets and hand pumps in 2nd October.</li> <li>• Celebrated global hand washing day in the camp with 100 (75 women and girl) participants on 15th October.</li> <li>• SCI assisted 12 PSN by providing wooden hafts in 21st October.</li> <li>• SCI shared in IAM that 120 damage toilet repair work is in progress during the month.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• IAM suggested to WASH volunteers for regular cleaning in the camp. Host communities requested to support toilets and hand pumps.</li> <li>• CMC requested in IAM to replace 4 damaged solar battery.</li> </ul>
<b>Community Service and protection</b> Agency – LWF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Supplied newspaper and magazine regularly during the month. 110 (25 women and girl) visited libraries and studied reading materials as their interest. With aiming to provide appropriate reading environment, LWF provided furniture (1 table, 2 book shelf and 4 chairs) for the library.</li> <li>• Conducted indoor recreational activities (painting, knit) on 2nd October and enjoyed by 96 (60 women and girl) participants.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CMCs and IDPs requested to provide livelihood activities.</li> </ul>
