<b>CCCM</b>  Agency – RSG, UNHCR and LWF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>LWF facilitated regular CMC meeting on 11<sup>th</sup> June. The meeting was participated by 30 (18 female) CMC members, representatives from camp based committee and social groups. The meeting discussed on issues (like water scarcity, sanitation, damaged shelter, seasonal disease, school enrolment, etc) concerns with IDP.</li> <li>Inter-agency meeting was held on 24<sup>th</sup> June and participated by 35 (22 Females) representatives from CMC, Social Groups (WDG, YDG) and LWF. The meeting reflected service provided by the agencies, discussed on camp issues and share brief plan for the coming month.</li> <li>EU mission visited to camp and LWF, UNHCR, CDN, UNOCHA and WFP participated on trip on 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2015.</li> <li>Diaconia ECCB visitors Mr. Jan Dus and Ms. Petra visited and interact on fire safety and IDP issues with CMC, WDG and fire volunteers on 25<sup>th</sup> June.</li> <li>LWF extended its support to CMC for camp management issues.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This month IA meeting did not participate by other agency due to different rumours.</li> <li>LWF informed it's next month plan to assist CMC meeting, Inter-agency meeting, Social group meeting, population update, open complaint box and repair complaint box.</li> </ul>

Student kits were supported to 711 (319 girls) on 15<sup>th</sup> June</li> <li>LWF commenced to conduct NFE centre through 4 (2 women) NFE Facilitators from first week of June. 127 (53 F) participants were enrolled in the centres.</li> <li>Township Education Office provided 149 student kits for grade one and 130 student kits for grade three students on 17<sup>th</sup> June.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>CMC requested to provide solar light for night study.</li> <li>CMC raised the issues of student kits for youth centre and NFE centres.</li> </ul>
