



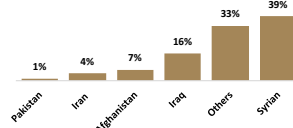

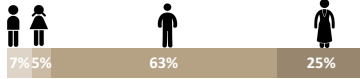

SECTOR HIGHLIGHTS

Since January 2017 the CWG partners continued to cover all sites on the Mainland and the islands. In February UNHCR rolled out cash cards with partner cards across UNHCR accommodations replacing vouchers. Greece Cash Alliance cards which are planned to replace all other partner cash cards gradually through the end of July were distributed for the first time at the end of February in UNHCR accommodations. A rowing surge verification team has been and is still visiting all sites on the mainland and islands enrolling and verifying PoCs into Progres database and distributing the new cards. Starting early May, PoCs residing in sites on the mainland having adequate infrastructure were provided with full cash grants (an increase from partial cash grants) in lieu of army catering which has now been discontinued at these sites. Most of the remaining sites are planned to follow by the end of June or July. The first GCA steering committee was held on 30/May/2017 with a number of policy decisions already made. The GCA technical working group are now holding weekly meetings and recommending ways forward on a number of areas including M&E, visibility, accountability, prevention of fraud and feedback mechanisms. The GCA has now replaced the CWG and comprises the following agencies: UNHCR, CRS, Mercy Corps, CARE, Samaritan's Purse, IFRC and IRC. It's meetings are restricted to GCA partners.

In January 2017, selected NFI WG members were actively finalising the distribution of winter clothes and footwear on mainland sites according to a plan coordinated centrally by the NFI WG coordinator and the MoMP, but delivered and implemented by the involved organisations, where possible and required through the facilitation of volunteer organisations on site involved with NFI distribution through kiosks modalities. The whole population in the mainland was covered with some exceptions due to the lack of appropriate sites, mostly due to two reasons: partial lack of baseline site data and availability based on donations. Thanks to bilateral and coordination mechanisms (site, sub-national and national level), medium-term collaborations were established and maintained among NFI actors, and donations from one agency to another were facilitated and actioned between site based actors operating in different regions. Cross-agency donations regarded baby items, hygiene and dignity kits/items, shoes, clothes, etc. In February a Basic NFI WG Assessment country wise, including islands, was launched to identify gaps, trends, redefine standard kits and answer some questions related to the Minimum Expenditure Basket (MEB) in support of the CASH WG and MEB consultant deployed to review it in March. In March the revised Standard NFI kits (including Core Relief Item kits for the islands, hygiene, male, female and baby kits) were discussed with NFI WG members, submitted to MoMP and donors for their final amendments and finally published in April 2017. Additionally, in April, a new Mainland Welcome Kit was designed and approved in support of newly admitted arrivals on the mainland sites, similar to the CRI for the islands, and a system was set in place with one of the SMS agencies to function as emergency preparedness mechanism for the mainland in case of a significant increase of mainland arrivals (procurement, warehousing, transportation to site, distribution on site). Similarly, an emergency preparedness plan was devised for the islands by UNHCR to guarantee a minimum response in case of increased shoreline landings in the second half of 2017. In April, a set of guidelines were developed in cooperation with donors and MoMP on how to proceed with NFI distributions, donations, liquidations and future procurements based on needs, linked with the new kits definition and the Multi-Purpose Grant rollout in Greece by the UNHCR and its implementing partners, both on the mainland and the islands.

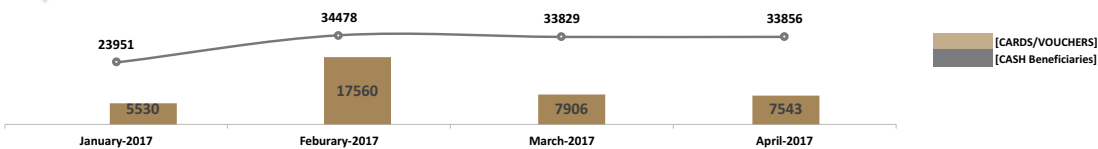


SECTOR PROGRESS PER TOP FOUR INDICATORS



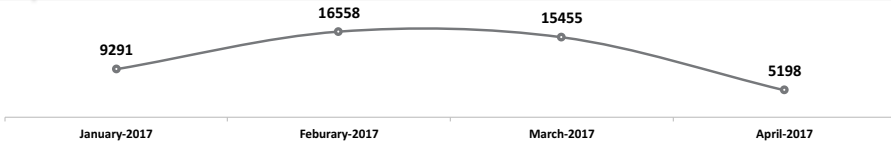
Objective 1: CASH Based Intervention

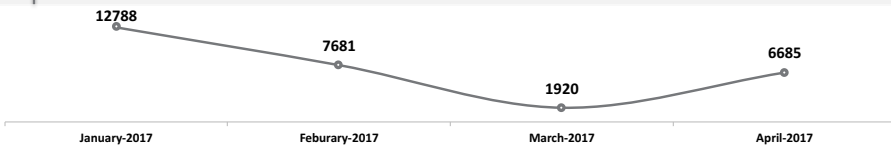
Objective 1: CASH Based Intervention

Indicator 1 [MPGs] # of new PoCs benefiting from MPGs



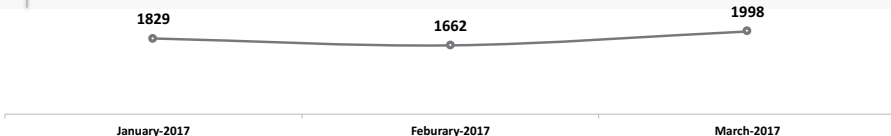
Objective 3 : Non-food (NFI) item
