

So far in 2017, over 996,300 individuals have benefited from access to adequate quantity of safe water through improved longer-term water systems. Approximately 327,400 people have gained access to appropriate sanitation facilities and services, and over 505,300 people have access to adequate quantity of safe water through temporary provision.

In Jordan, in Azraq, the expansion of the water network continued with the completion of 53 additional tap stands. The construction of 152 WASH blocks in Village 2 extension was completed benefiting more than 4,000 people, and 38 ramps were constructed to improve access of people with disabilities to WASH facilities in the camp. In Iraq, water demand increases each summer, as temperature regularly rise to 45 degrees centigrade or more. This coupled with an overall worsening ground water situation and reduced electricity supply hours, has presented challenges for WASH partners. As both quality and quantity of water from groundwater sources has declined. New bore wells are planned to serve Erbil camps, while in Dahuk water trucking has been increased and feeding a pipeline extended connecting the area to existing nearby wells, serving 1,200 people. In the longer term, alternative solutions include connecting to surface water sources rather than ground water.

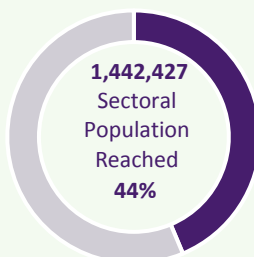
Syrian Registered Refugees in

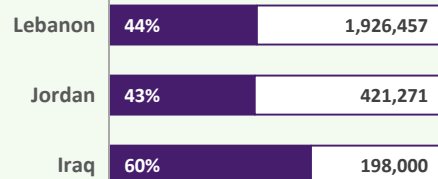


**2,545,700** Refugees & Local Community Members Sectoral Target by end of 2017

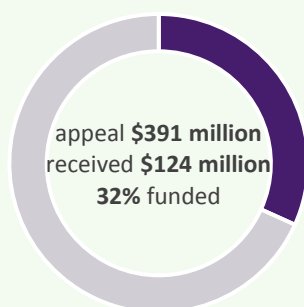

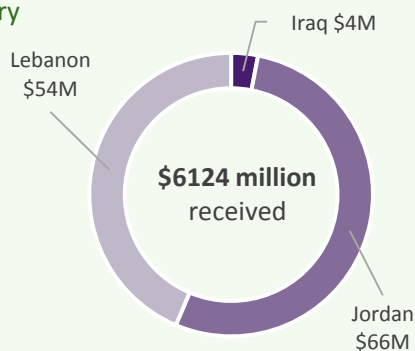


## 3RP 2017 Sectoral Funding Status

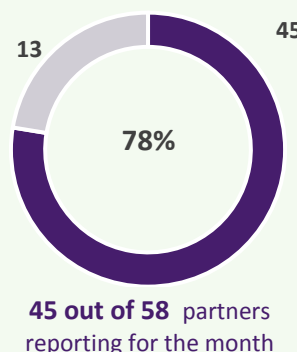
