<p>Update from task forced and field working group:</p>	<p>Zaatari Camp:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CP/GBV SWG Zaatari started awareness sessions in coordination with IMC and FPD on CP related issues and “how to protect your child”. IMC and FPD are looking to reach out all the districts. • JHAs started to provide awareness sessions on Early Marriage in coordination with FPD. <p>Azraq Camp:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Family reunification in for UAC: During January 13 UAC were reunified with their families inside Azraq Camp and 3 UAC joined their families in urban. During February of 5 UAC were reunified with their families as well (2 in the urban, 1 inside Zaatari Camp and 2 in Azraq) • UNHCR-SRAD initiative: A new initiative that took place UNHCR Protection Unit in partnership with SRAD to start a new direction of UAC in the IRC reception area, to resolve the issues of children who have family members in Jordan. SRAD established a new department inside Azraq to deal with the issues of UAC. Additionally the head of SRAD Azraq has agreed to extend the leaves of all the children who have relatives residing legally in Azraq Camp. <p>During February, SRAD has informed UNHCR that they are</p>		

	<p>conducting a study on early marriage.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • BERM: Vaccination campaign is planned to start beginning April (pending JAF approval). Health care are still received in the clinic. Limited numbers of admissions related to health emergency. • Education Sector: back to school campaign has finished, the final numbers are not shared yet. Unfortunate majority of the children have failed to enroll in the school, Education Sector is looking at the reasons why those children were not enrolled and a way forward to find solutions in the future. Admission numbers will be shared once they are announced. 		
War Child project – Time to be a Child	War Child UK and War Child Canada presented on their project, ‘Time to Be a Child’, which is a three-year project implemented in Lebanon and Jordan. In Jordan implementation began in December across 6 centres in Amman, Zarqa, Mafraq and Za’atari. The activities include ECCD, PSS, Youth engagement, Positive Parenting, Community-based child protection and recreational activities. A research study will accompany the project on the impact of the War Child PSS methodology.

	<p>Protection NFWFP was launched in 2016 as a reference policy document that</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Provides unified local definitions related to family violence, - Defines roles and responsibilities and overall guidance to actors dealing with family violence in Jordan. <p>National Framework for Family Protection was framed based on Survivor center, the Case Management and multidisciplinary multi-sectorial approaches</p> <p>Prevention Tiers and phases of response were highlighted to members.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - SOPs for the NFFv is currently under development, training package to be developed, a TOT to be conducted to all relevant stakeholders - SOPs on CP and GBV is under revision in line with National Framework for Protection from Family Violence. A semi-final draft will be presented in a national workshop on 3-4/4/2017 		
Brief on Primero mission- IMC , NCFA and UNHCR	<p>During February CPIMS+ development company did a mission to do several consultations with key CPIMS stakeholders such as IMC, IRC and they were involved in all the technical aspects of the developments details of the National Tracking System.</p> <p>Following the consultations, next week the testing on the Primero will start to make sure it's complementing to the National Framework.</p>
