Organized CMC meeting and attended by 35 (12 women) representatives from camp based committees (Food Management Committee-FMC), Disability, and Women Development Group-WDG) and discussed on community and service issues 9th March. LWF facilitate workshop on roles and responsibility of camp management committee with 30 (15 women) participants from 24th March. LWF provided communication and coordination support to CMC and IWI on 24th March. Camp level Inter-Agency Meeting (IAM) was held and participated by 34 (13 women) representatives from CMC, CDN, SCI, FMC, WDG, Youth Development Group-YDG), DRC, MM, Security Police and LWF on 29th March. LWF provided camp coordination and camp management badge for incentive worker and incentive worker in charge 20 (10 women) as their identity on 8th March. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Five letters received by LWF through complaint box and was request letter for food ration. LWF submitted the letter to WFP and UNHCR on 7th and 17th March. Families and population are decreasing in the camp. LWF is verifying the numbers. Now 2,233 families with 11731 populations are occupying 2245 rooms. As received information some families back to their place, some shifted camps and other camps and Yangon, etc.
