Camp Coordination and Camp Management Agency- Lutheran World Federation(LWF)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Conducted CCCM TOT training, included modules, camp life cycle, role and responsibility of CA, CC and CM, monitoring, varieties of camp setting and , participated by 20 (9 women) camp based incentive workers organized by IOM, on 12th January. Conducted CMC meeting attended 33 (16 women) representatives from CMC, camp-based committees and Incentive Workers held and discussed about burning issues such as insecure camp situation from theft especially at night, on 14th January UNHCR monitored the camp situation and discussed with IDPs who receive food ration from MRF on 21st January. Conducted camp level Inter-agency coordination meeting and participated by 36(18 women) representatives from CMC, CDN, IOM, DRC, SCI, and LWF and discussed the concerns with updates on 27th January. LWF also did activity audit of 2015 during the meeting. 4 (3 girls) babies were born and 4 men died of extremely cold and 6 months girl died of during this month. HH survey and population verification survey completed 90%. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure allocate building/place for field work of IWs as current place are not appropriate to listen the voice of community because it is situated almost outside the camp. 2 IWs has to be recruited because of resignation. Stationary for CMC office and provide the Incentive Worker Training, will be implemented on February.

CDN and MRF did not distribute food ration in January. Due to food distribution delayed, stolen cases were increased noted by CMC.
