
IRAQ: Camps Intention Survey Snapshot Analysis: September 2017




This Intention Survey was carried out by the CCCM partners ((DRC, IOM, NRC, UNHCR, ACTED and RNVDO) across 14 Emergency Camps and Sites of the Mosul response hosting a total of 56.634 households (311,843 individuals). The survey was administered to 4,916 households, corresponding to 28,267 individuals through a random sample¹ between 18 August to 8 September.



What is the condition of your house in area of origin?








If Yes! What are the main reason why you would like to return now to your area of Origin?




When do you think will return? 54%






