<p>Present Protection Dashboard</p>	<p>UNHCR Information Management Officer presented the newly developed Protection Sector Dashboard and Project Location Mapping to members of the CP SWG. Protection Sector dashboard demonstrate the achievements/progress that have been reported through ActivityInfo by different agencies each month using demographic and automated charts using different filters. The dashboard will assist different parties to assess the performance on the sector/agencies and helps to identify the gaps along with other tools that was developed by UNHCR information Management team such as Financial Tracking System and Services Advisor. Additionally Coordination Associate presented the Project Location Map that shows all the projects that were submitted on ActivityInfo by members on the Map of Jordan, specifying their activity per location. 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<p>Update from Child Labor Task Force</p>	<p>Save the children Protection officer updated members on the National child labor TF. It was highlighted that advocacy messages were completed among other tasks for the network. Ending the Child labor task force and bringing its activities and TORs under the CPSWG was discussed.</p>	<p>Studies by any organization on CL to be shared with CLTF</p>	
<p>Discussion on Jordan Humanitarian Fund and CP related priorities</p>	<p>Sector Coordinator briefed members on the second call for the proposals, which is expected to be announced in early September. The maximum funding for one project is US\$ 400,000. The Fund is meant to meet the emerging needs and to fill in humanitarian gaps. The thematic focus of the second call for the proposal will be “winterization”.</p> <p>Members were requested to identify and suggest sector priorities that is related to winterization or a gap to be considered as a priority with justification The JHF priorities are more specific than the broader programme priorities, and this mainly due to:</p> <p>1) the short term nature of the JHF-funded projects: the need to identify projects that can pass the projects’ review processes quickly and be implemented or scaled up within a short-space of time</p>		

	<p>2) the relatively small amount of funding involved in the JHF, and the need to select projects that can have a meaningful impact/are suited to smaller scale programming;</p> <p>3) the principle that NGOs should be prioritized as the recipients of JHF funding over UN agencies</p> <p>Action Point: Members to identify and suggest Protection sector priorities for the second round of JHF.</p>		
<p>Brief update on Jordan Response Plan and Review current CP indicators:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CP Coordinator mentioned that the Government of Jordan started the JRP planning phase recently, and it is expected that JRP Social Protection Task Force and Justice Task Force chairs will start to call for first meetings with partners including UN agencies, NGOs and donors in coming days. Sector Coordinator brief members on the process that involves preparation of the Comprehensive Vulnerability Assessment (CVA), Sector Response Strategy, and Project Summary Sheet (PSS) which determine the financial ceiling for the Protection Sector projects after discussions with the government. After finalizing the PSS the Inter-Agency Appeal process (3RP) starts by requesting members who are interested to be part of the 3RP to submit their planned activities they want to implement using ActivityInfo. • Sector Coordinator emphasized on members commitment and cooperation through the JRP process, the CP SWG will start requesting partners to start planning their activities/budgets/targets in order to be prepared or the JRP process and have a concrete vision on the required resources needed to be negotiated with 		

	<p>the Government.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CP sub-sector 2017 CP 3RP indicators were circulated with members for their review/comments and suggestions, the purpose is to indicate if certain indicators are valid and if any unmet areas needs to be measured. 		
<p>CP Mid-Year performance report (Financial Tracking system and CP Progress report)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sector coordinator presented the progress report for reporting protection key activities on the Activityinfo. • Sector coordinator emphasized on the importance of reporting and how it effects the overall sector performance .Additionally sector coordinator highlighted the impact reporting has on the JRP Process, 3RP reporting and donors funding. Members who face any challenges in reporting to contact Protection Sector Coordination Associate shehadeg@unhcr.org. • Child Protection 2nd Quarter financial tracking system was presented to members. As of end of June 42% of the funds requested for this year have received to members that appealed for activities (8 USD Million received out of total of 19 USD Million requested by). 13 organizations out of 17 received funds while 4 organization did not receive any requested funds so far.
