




HIGHLIGHTS


By the end of the third quarter of 2017, over 950,000 people across the country received monthly cash-based assistance and close to 270,000 people benefitted from one-time cash assistance to cover specific needs. Almost 330,000 people have availed of core relief items as well as over 417,000 receiving various hygiene, dignity and sanitary kits. Through the Basic Needs Working Group (BNWG), Sector partners have reviewed achievements and challenges to-date to inform planning and programming for 2018/9. An Inter-Agency Shelter/WASH Assessment, co-led by IOM and UNHCR, being finalized in September, aims to inform programming to address household-level shelter and WASH needs. A total of almost 57,000 people have benefitted from assistance to achieve adequate shelter solutions, of which nearly 8,000 are outside of the Temporary Accommodation Centres.

Members of the Basic Needs Working Group reactivated the Winter Task Force in July to facilitate planning for winter 2017/2018. The Task Force analyzed the need for winter support in 2017/2018, outlining findings in an inter-agency advocacy note. The Task Force has also developed standard operating procedures to guide and harmonize winter assistance measures as well as a 4W matrix to ensure broad coverage and avoid duplication.
