

OVERVIEW

UNHCR launched the Family Counting exercise on 4 October 2017. A team of over 100 staff is families and issuing them a card with a unique identifier, the Family Counting Number. The family counting helps to identify among the refugee population and also be a useful baseline data for density per locations.











BREAKDOWN OF IDENTIFIED VULNERABILITIES*
