<p>Security Update</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • General situation was reported calm and stable. • From Monday – Thursday (4-7\12\2017) a group of youth gathered to demonstrate for Work chance at Baghdad road in front of Zadari village near to Zadari camp. On Thursday the demonstrator threw stone on NGO and UNHCR vehicle. No major injury or damage were reported. One female staff of Save the Children who sustained minor injuries was rushed to one of the camp clinics for check-up. As response to this UNHCR, Governorate authorities in Mafraq and partners will meet in ZC on 12\12\2017 to look into the work chance and requirements plans. 	
<p>Winterization:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Challenges: Some organization did not upload the list of applicant who received winterization from their side. Which affected the support of other refugee. • NOTE: whenever support Jordanian beneficiaries, to share the beneficiaries list with MOSD (Ministry of social development) or coordinate with them to avoid duplication. 	<p>ACTIONPOINT: send reminder to those organization to upload their beneficiaries list. Filed unit-UNHCR.</p>

The definition of family changed in at the new Law, the mandatory reporting process, consequences on not reporting the cases. Mays will share the Arabic version from the new law. in the next Coordination mee • Discussion with Amman SGBV working group is needed to know how to adapt and apply the new law.
