

About Caritas Jordan

- ▶ A member of Caritas International which belongs to Vatican with its head office in Rome.
- ▶ Is also part of MONA regional network which includes North Africa and the Middle East.
- ▶ The first Caritas organization was founded in Freiburg, Germany in 1897.
- ▶ In Jordan was established in 1967 in response to the humanitarian crisis of the Six Days War.
- ▶ Head quarters based in Amman with 18 centers distributed all over the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan covering 9 out of 12 governorates to reach the most needy, marginalized and vulnerable.





Caritas Jordan Goals

- ▶ Provide health services in addition to maternity and child services.

Sectors


- ▶ Caritas Jordan is providing services and assistance to more than 100,000 people per year in the following sectors:



Health Sector Activities

- ▶ Provided in 12 Caritas Jordan Centers
- ▶ 10 GP well-equipped Clinics providing Primary Health Care Services
- ▶ 6 Dental Clinics
- ▶ Areas: Amman, Zarqa, Irbid, Mafraq, Balqa, Madaba and Karak
- ▶ Secondary and Emergency Health Care is provided through partner service providers including renowned hospitals and medical-related facilities.




