

# Returns from Greece to Turkey

In the framework of the EU-TUR Statement. Source: Press Releases, Greek Ministry of Citizen Protection.

## Overview

The vast majority of those returned to Turkey are nationals from countries other than Syria. The majority are **Pakistani nationals (42 per cent of total)**. Syrians constitute **16 per cent** of the total number of those returned, and are followed by Algerians, Bangladeshis and Afghans.

In total, **250 Syrians** have been returned to Turkey to date. **12** of them have been returned on the basis that their asylum claims were found inadmissible at 2nd instance.

Of all those returned, **51 per cent** did not express a will to apply for asylum or withdrew their will to apply for asylum or withdrew their asylum claims in Greece.

## Total returns by age and gender






## Return trend - April 2016 to January 2018




## Nationality of those returned
