


CAMP COORDINATION AND CAMP MANAGEMENT CLUSTER

General update

In February, CCCM cluster partners reached 487, 855 displaced people in nine different districts. Partners' activities included coordination and information management, improving and maintaining sites, working with communities to support information, feedback and community self-management.

Camp Management

- In Dolow, CCCM conducted a five-days operation to create an address system in Qansaxlay to give each household a unique number. The address system will improve beneficiary identification and site management.
- CCCM partners in Baidoa relocated 150 HHs in Yaarabi IDP settlement that were given an eviction notice. They were relocated to communal land and the camp management team mobilized neighbouring displaced communities to facilitate their integration into existing settlements.
- Introduction to CCCM Trainings was conducted for Community Leaders in Kismayo. CCCM partners in Kismayo conducted a series of 4 "Introduction to CCCM" training sessions, one for each of the 4 site clusters around Kismayo' town: Galbeet, Fanole, Central, Dalxiska. The purpose of each training session was to explain to the community leaders what CCCM activities will be implemented in all the Kismayo sites, and also to give the leadership some basic skills training on best practices of camp management.


- The Kismayo CCCM sub-cluster led a joint verification exercise in February and verified 145 IDP sites grouped into 4 clusters: Galbeet Cluster, Dalxiska Cluster, Fanole Cluster and Central Cluster. The sub-cluster will conduct this type of exercise quarterly, ensuring the IDP sites list of Kismayo is kept up to date as well as the site locations.
- Service mapping was updated in Garowe. This informs on which partners provide key services at sites and allows CCCM partners to flag duplication in activities and gaps in services. To compliment the Detailed Site Assessment, the CCCM cluster has developed a new tool to improve site level data. The Comprehensive Site Assessment aims at collecting data at household level in IDP sites as well as mapping district level infrastructure in partnership with the Shelter Cluster. The tool has been reviewed by clusters to ensure relevant data is collected at sectorial level and will be launched in the coming weeks.


