NGO roles

Main points raised by NGOs in Field Launches

- ▶ Committed to comprehensive approach - saw a role for NGOs within it
- ▶ Highlighted local expertise / knowledge an advantage
- ▶ Solutions are best achieved at the local level.
- ▶ Noted importance inclusion of refugees and host communities in the formulation of plans and solutions - and facilities.
- ▶ iNGOs believe in the CRRF process, and can contribute to solutions - committed to support.

NGO roles - concerns and benefits

- ▶ Several referred to the CRRF effort as something “bringing another package” of aid,
- ▶ Concerned about future in the CRRF process as systems moving away from aid delivery.

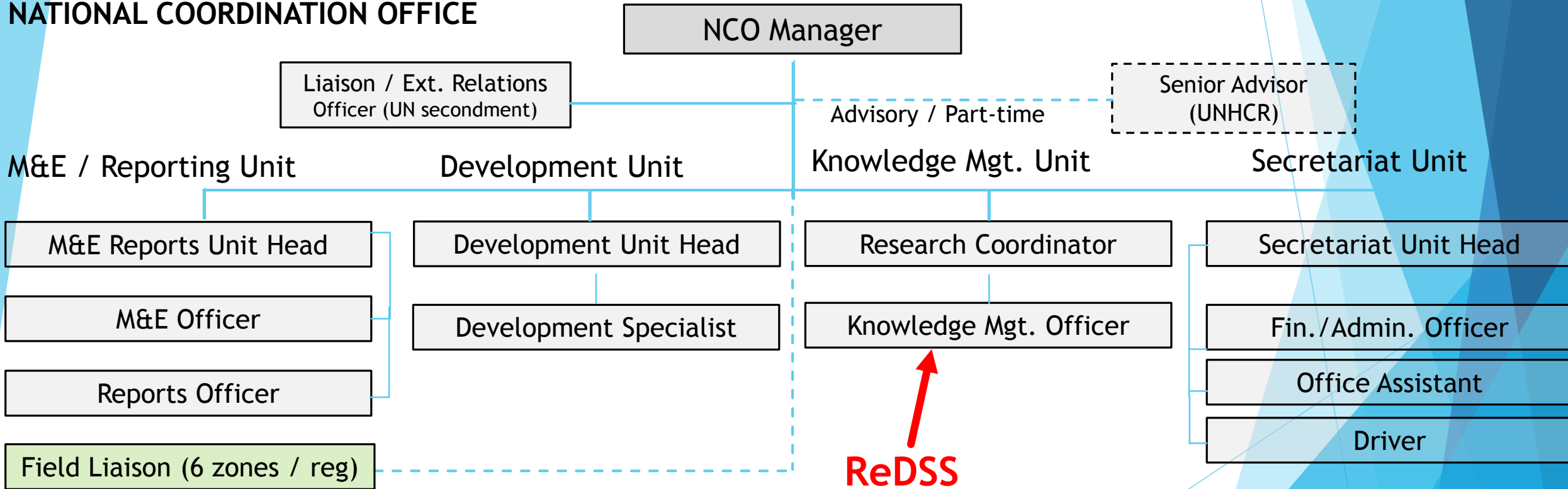
- ▶ A beneficial role when NGOs well-established with ongoing operations in refugee-affected areas.
- ▶ With established links to refugees and host communities - NGOs are valuable partners in implementation, and overall community consultation, assessment and planning of needs.

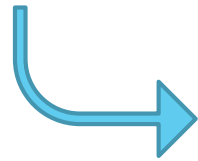
TECHNICAL COMMITTEES - FIELD IMPLEMENTATION

Engaging Line Ministries - with ARRA / UNHCR support

- ▶ Define 'AREA' - Refugee Camp and Immediate Hosting Area
- ▶ Map Assets by sector / status of functionality, usage etc. - also service vs. standards
- ▶ Map Regional / Woreda priorities
- ▶ Consult refugees and host communities on priorities / inputs
- ▶ Map ongoing / committed improvements - eg. other programmes
- ▶ Map GAPS - prioritized

CONCEPT NOTES / PROJECT PROPOSALS

UNHCR Role:

- Support Local Area Development / Area-Based Planning (BoFED lead)
- Identification of gaps - prepare concept notes
- Support monitoring / reporting
- Advocacy / Resource Mobilization

Implementer. Partner Role:

- Prepare detailed project proposals
- Receive and account for funds
- Manage implementation
- Engage, support overall assessments, planning, prioritization, partnerships
