HIGHLIGHTS

Access:

- 169 students were supported with transportation costs (103 drop-out students to rejoin secondary schools
- 969 students registered and attending catch up classes: 222 males and 212 females for primary aged students and 274 males and 261 females for secondary aged students.
- Remedial education support were provided to 907 (437 Girls and 470 Boys) Syrian refugee children, aiming to increase the capacity of the children and prepare them for the final exam.

General directorate of Education in Sulaimaniyah were supported to provide incentives of March to 238 volunteer teaching and nonteaching staff (69 males & 169 females) in 8 Syrian refugee schools of Sulaimaniyah. The total number of children who benefit is 3,555 (1,753 girls and 1,802 Boys).
