

## OPD Consultations


During the reporting period, a total of 6,705 OPD consultations were made compared to 6,612 reported the previous week. The leading causes of illness (proportional morbidity) were Acute Respiratory Tract Infections/RTI (24.4%), Malaria (11.2%) followed by Watery Diarrhoea/WD (6.5%); this implies that the three top disease conditions contributed about 42% of the total morbidity for the reporting week.

The incidences for Malaria, RTIs and watery diarrhoea this week are estimated at 3, 7 and 2 cases/1,000 persons/week respectively. No cases of bloody diarrhoea or Typhoid were

reported.

No new cases/suspects for Viral Haemorrhagic Fevers/ Rift Valley fever were reported.

## Mortality:



A total of five (5) deaths (0 F; 5 M), including one (1) child under the age of five and two (2) elderly person above 60 years were registered (4- *Public Referral Health Facility; 1 Settlement Facility)*. Probable causes of deaths were as follows: Tuberculosis (1), Anaemia (1), Birth asphyxia (1), cancer of esophagus (1) and liver cancer (1).

The Crude Mortality Rate (CMR) and Under 5 mortality rates are estimated at 0.03 deaths/10,000/day respectively for both indicators, which are both below the emergency threshold of 1 and 2 deaths/10,000/day respectively.

#### Mental Health and Psychosocial Support:

Total number of consultations during the week were 212 (79 new cases and 133 revisits). Consultations were made for Epilepsy (165), Depression (17), Psychosis (21), Drug abuse (8), no suicide attempt or completed suicide reported.

#### Reproductive Health, HIV/AIDS:

Total for ANC 1 was 170, ANC 4 was 126 and PNC was 177, while 135 deliveries were conducted (with 26 deliveries by nationals). One hundred and eighty seven (187) mothers were tested during ANC; None tested positive. The Number of new clients enrolled on ART during this week is 1.

#### • Expanded program for immunization, Vitamin A supplementation and deworming:

A total of 156 doses of DPT 3 and equal doses for PCV3; 173 doses of measles and 129 doses of BCG were administered to children in the settlement; 652 doses of vitamin A supplements and 781 doses of deworming tablets were also given.

#### Achievements: Narrative

- A total of 15 children aged 6-59 months were enrolled in the feeding programs in the reporting period (0 in ITC, 4 in OTC and 11 in SFP). A total of 2,042 children were screened during the week.
- A total of **998** pregnant and lactating women were screened, only **01** was identified and enrolment into the SFP program.
- A total of **583** children aged 6-59 months were reached by MCHN while **1,115** Pregnant and Lactating women were reached.
- One (1) child under ITC and 06 under OTC recovered; No defaulters or deaths were reported this week.

#### Infant and Young Child Feeding:

- During this reporting period, a total of 67 mother-baby pairs accessed the 3 mother-baby areas of Yangani (31), Ombechi (18) and Kiranga (185).
- Out of the 67 mother-baby pairs mentioned above, 16 pairs were accessing MBAs for their first time this year while 51 came for follow up visits.
- All Mother- Baby pairs were assessed, those with breastfeeding difficulties received full assessment, and then one-on-one skilled counselling was offered. Mothers and caretakers without breastfeeding difficulties were given key messages concerning appropriate Infant and Young Child Feeding in Emergencies, and some came to breastfeed.
- Conducted 3 health outreaches at the MBAs; this reached a total of 252 children and 203 Pregnant and Lactating Women.
