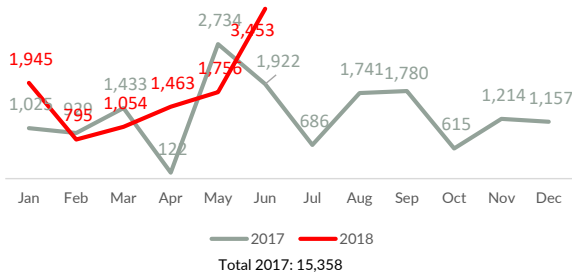


Libya continues to be the main transit point for departure from North Africa towards Europe. UNHCR's interventions at disembarkation points in Libya focus on the provision of life-saving assistance and protection monitoring, to identify persons in need of international protection, as well as vulnerable individuals, such as unaccompanied and separated children, elderly, medical cases, women at risk or victims of trafficking. **UNHCR through its partner International Medical Corps provides medical services and core relief items.** In addition, UNHCR rehabilitated WASH facilities at six disembarkation points, in Azzawya, Tripoli (3), Tajoura (Al Hamidiyah) and Alkhums.

As of 30 June 2018, the Libyan Coast Guard rescued/intercepted a total of 10,466 people in different locations along the Libyan coast. 3,453 individuals were rescued/intercepted in June, 1,756 in May and 1,463 in April. Since 1 January 2018, Libyan local authorities have recovered 73 bodies of people who perished while attempting to cross the Mediterranean towards Europe.

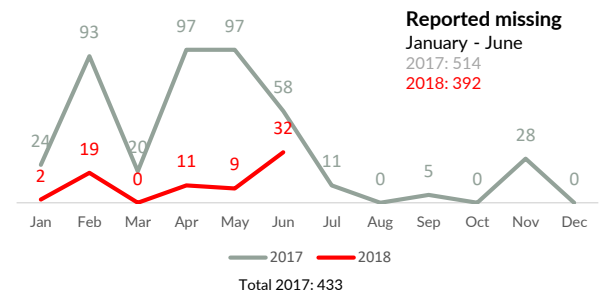
**Monthly trends - people rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard in 2017-2018**

From January to June 2018, 10,466 people were rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard, an increase of 28.1% compared to the same period in 2017.

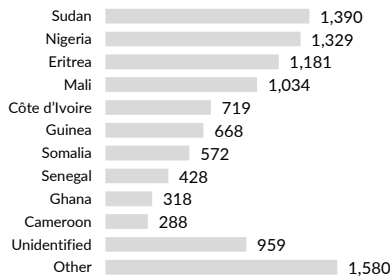


**Monthly trends - recorded loss of life in Libyan waters in 2017-2018**

From January to June 2018, 73 dead bodies were recovered in Libyan waters, compared to 389 over the same period in 2017.

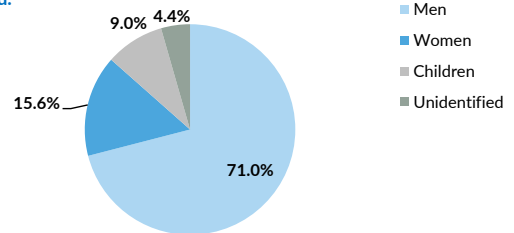


**Top 10 nationalities rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard in 2018**

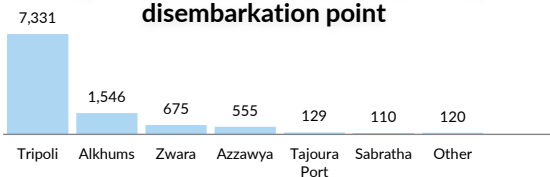


**People rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard in 2018 by group**

Of the total of 10,466 people rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard, 7,428 were men, 1,628 women, 945 children and 465 unidentified.

As of 30 June 2018, UNHCR, through its partner International Medical Corps, provided medical assistance to 1,062 people and distributed 7,175 hygiene kits at six health posts.
