



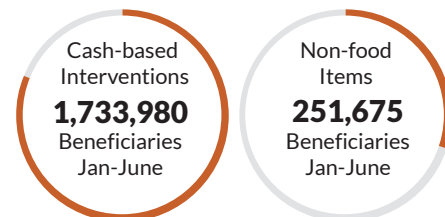
HIGHLIGHTS

During the second quarter of 2018, the IOM-led Winter Task Force engaged in a Post-Distribution Monitoring exercise for the winter assistance provided during the winter season 2017-2018. Initial findings demonstrate that the majority of cash beneficiaries chose to spend their cash assistance on food, rent and utilities, whereas e-voucher beneficiaries purchased winter clothing, fuel/coal and blankets. Discussions are on-going regarding plans for similar seasonal assistance to be provided for the upcoming winter season 2018-2019. Coordination of this assistance will be conducted within the Basic Needs working groups, as required.

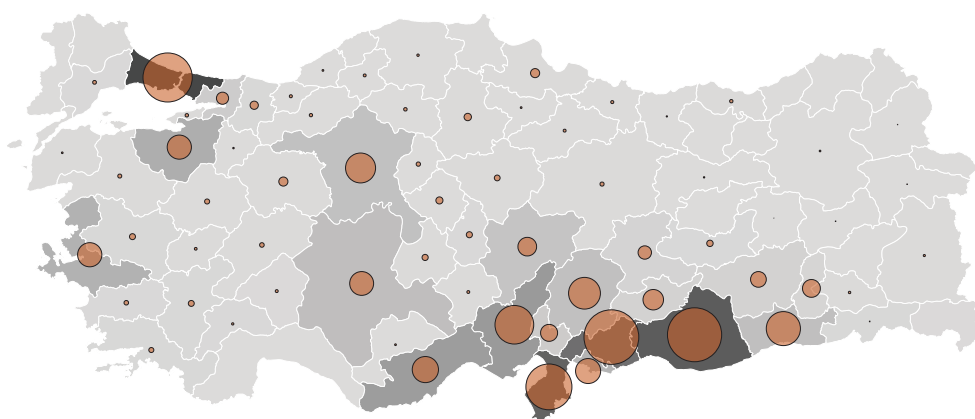
The Inter-Agency Shelter Programming Guidelines have been finalized by Basic Needs sector partners and will be disseminated following final inputs on livelihoods elements such as Cash for Work modalities.

Activities at the municipal level including large-scale infrastructure works and localized WASH and communal living space upgrades have been initiated. Certain smaller scale engagements have been completed while others, with longer project cycles remain ongoing.

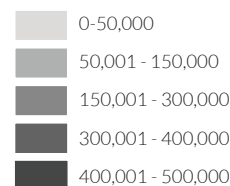
Efforts to build strengthened linkages between the Basic Needs and Livelihoods sectors remain a priority. Discussions surrounding opportunities for refugees to move from Basic Needs assistance to Livelihoods activities and the promotion of self-reliance and resilience have begun and plans are in place to continue to bring the two sectors closer to promote this transition through more joined up programming and planning.
