1. **JICA**: presentation of good practice example on inclusive action; presentation by Syrian with disabilities sharing his/her experiences; Q&A and discussion

<u>Presentation 1</u>: JICAs presentation related to a **good example of** inclusive action – Sport activity implemented with Syrian people with disabilities. The presentation is in attachment 1.

Nizar Saraijy from JICA explained the conceptual framework of the intervention, JICA training courses and the Good Practice in Humanitarian Response.

The key elements of the successful achievement are related to the involvement of persons with disabilities in the whole process, as they are trained and empowered to become peer-counselors and write proposal for activities: The sports activity came from this process.

The selection of the sport considers the following aspects:

- Safety and feasibility without additional/specific rehabilitation
- 2. Cost and the need of special equipment
- **3.** Type of sport where Jordanians are good at, so exchanges can happen and refugees learn from the host community

Finally table tennis was selected.

Caregiver and drivers were also part of the training with the aim to support persons with disabilities and promote social participation.

To illustrate the positive outcome of their project, JICA presented the progress report prepared by of one of the participants, who recorded how much the sports activity has increased his ability to manage his everyday life (e.g. after several months of training, the participant was able to eat by himself for the first time in his life).

<u>Presentation 2:</u> A complementary presentation by Khaled Khattab (Disability Equality Training facilitator and peer-counselor trained by JICA as well as Focal point for UPP) in attachment 2. He introduced a number of good practices and practical examples of small actions that helped influence the immediate environment of Syrian with disabilities and significantly improve daily life.

The presentation included views from persons with disabilities and was based on Mr Khattab's experience as a peer-counselor. His powerful explanations highlighted in particular the feeling of being "sick" at first (just after becoming disabled) and the difficulty to become "agent of change", as they first need to understand and accept their new condition. Peer-counselors provide the "inspiration" to facilitate this transition. Mr Khattab confessed that he was himself surprised to "discover" to which extent he had been empowered to change things.

#### **Q&A** and further exchange:

JICA shared their immediate intention to create a new group of Women with Disabilities, involving a similar empowering process and involving mother groups. On the long term, a DPO could be created.

DTF members were interested to understand how social cohesion is promoted between Jordanians and Syrians by involving both groups together. JICA shared some intents to approach Jordanian DPOs that were unsuccessful due to misalignment in approach to voluntary involvement. Mercy Corps proposed to share some key contact to further the exchange between national and refugee organizations.

All DTF members to provide feedback on JICA's good practice example on inclusion Other questions were related to the "strategies" used to convince community members to change attitudes and decide to act to include persons with disabilities. Examples included supermarket owner building ramps, enlarging ales and accessible placing of key products after the group of Syrians with disabilities — under the leadership of peer-counselors — engaged in strategic lobbying activities with shopkeepers in their respective neighborhoods. Following their advocacy, the Imam of the local mosque agreed to make the mosque accessible to persons with disabilities and arranged for the modification of the sidewalk in front of the mosque — a move that was not only appreciated by Khaled but also persons with disabilities belonging to the host community, who, as they told Khaled, were able to pray there the first time in their life as well.

JICA has also finalized the Good Practice overview in the DTF template. It is now ready to be shared.

#### 2. Inclusion across all sectors

# Feedback/Updates from the DTF sector representatives in the different Working Groups

- Nutrition WG by IOCC UNICEF and UNHCR have an extra supply of plumpy nut that needs to be distributed before the end of the year. IOCC suggested to share them with adults and including PwD.
- Education WG by Mercy Corps ESWG is interested to receive the good practices from DTF (Mercy Corps).

#### Way forward regarding nomination of sector focal points

After some months of looking to stimulate DTF members to become focal points, the nomination remains unachieved. The DTF chairs are therefore proposing to temporarily set the topic aside to focus on thematic areas of common interest.

## Finalization of DTF Briefing Note for dissemination in Working Groups

The draft Briefing note presenting the DTF targeting working groups has been circulated among the members. The groups has now validated the content, the document is now final (Attached 3).

HI and UNHCR will look at improving the layout of the document and once finalized, upload it on the DTF page for broad use and dissemination.

## Discussion on DTF Presentations in the Working Groups, including presentation of rough version of DTF Power Point

A draft presentation to introduce the DTF to the other working groups has been prepared, with the content of the Briefing note. This could be used as a basis for DTF members share. The presentation is well received in concepts and content (attached 4). Initial opportunities to strengthen the visibility and therefore impact of the DTF in the coordination system have been identified:

- Protection WG has invited DTF for a One hour thematic meeting in July (TBC).
- CSMI requested national DTF to join the next meeting, this will be the opportunity to strengthen the linkages between field and national level
