### PROTECTION


**1,991**   
new Burundian  
refugee arrivals **granted  
access to territory**, in the  
first half of 2018

pending **Refugee Status  
Determination** with REC  
as of 30 June

### EDUCATION

**48**   
**classrooms constructed**  
in the first half of 2018

**74%**   
of Burundian primary school  
aged children **enrolled in  
primary education**

**There are  
not enough  
teachers,**  
with an average  
of 100 students  
per teacher



### FOOD

**32,263**   
Burundian refugees  
received monthly in-kind  
food assistance in the  
first half of 2018


**2,210**   
Burundian refugees  
received monthly cash based  
food assistance in the  
first half of 2018

The **vast  
majority** of  
**Burundian**  
refugees  
are unable to produce  
their own food




### HEALTH AND NUTRITION

**3,795**   
Burundian refugees  
reached with Mother and  
Child Nutrition  
Programmes

**95%** of **Burundian  
refugee women**   
delivered with the  
assistance of qualified  
health personnel

**Anaemia rates  
were over 25%**  
in settlements  
hosting  
Burundian  
refugees




### LIVELIHOODS AND ENVIRONMENT

**UGX 78,745,000**  
(USD 21,200) disbursed as  
loans to **Burundian refugee  
entrepreneurs** in 2018




**306 Burundian  
refugees received  
vocational training skills  
in the first half of 2018**

**Less than 50%**  
of households had  
**access to arable  
land** in 2018 

### SHELTER AND NFIs

**100%**   
of recognised **Burundian  
refugees** received  
non-food items  
in the first half of 2018

**100%** of recognised  
Burundian refugees  
received  
emergency  
shelter kits 

**99.5%**   
of Burundian refugees  
with **specific needs**  
lacked semi-permanent  
shelter in the first half  
of 2018

### WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE

**99.8%**   
of water supplied  
through **sustainable  
water supply systems**  
by mid 2018

**6,407** Burundian  
refugee families  
provided with soap 

**34%** of  
**refugee  
families**  
have no access to  
**household latrines**
