Health & Nutrition Food Security WASH

Health and nutrition

Improved health and nutrition status of refugees to reduce mortality, morbidity and malnutrition rates.

Objective 1: Health status of the population Improved

- Improve access to health services- increase functional health posts
- Improve EPI (vaccination) coverage
- Health promotion through community outreach

Objective 2: Nutritional wellbeing improved

- Further reduction of Global Acute malnutrition (GAM) (from 13,3% to < 10%)
- Strengthen cross sectoral linkages esp. food security, livelihoods & WASH

Objective 3: Optimal access to reproductive health and HIV services

- Improve ANC coverage (53% to 70% for ANC 4)
- Improve family planning uptake (prevalence from 7 to 20%)
- HIV- access to prevention, early diagnosis, care and support

Health and nutrition: resilience and inclusion

- Sector plan links with CRRF and GoE pledges regarding basic and social services and is integrated within overall development environment: SDGs (3 &2), National Plans (HSTP II) and UNDAF
- 2. Assisting host communities PHC services available for host community free of charge (2% total consultations)
- Building national capacity- targeted trainings, mobilise support for gambella Government Hospital to increase referral care capacity foir host community and refugees
- 4. Nutrition link with small scale livelihoods programmes

Food Security

Provision of food assistance to prevent malnutrition and morbidity and mortality

Objectives

- Provide all refugees living in camps monthly in kind food assistance (2,100 Kcal / person/ day) and further exploration of cash to replace part of in kind
- Provide blanket supplementary feeding for children under 5 and pregnant and lactating women
- Expand fresh food voucher programmes to increase dietary diversity
- Expand small scale livelihoods initiatives inc. backyard gardening
- Linkages with nutrition programme identifying most vulnerable

WASH

Refugees and surrounding host communities will continue to access water in sufficient quality and quantity and sanitation facilities with a focus on seeking sustainability and cost efficiency

Objective 1: Ensure population has access to clean and safe water

- Support functionality of Itang Water Utility and seek expansion to other camps
- Progressive solarisation of water pumping installations

Objective 2: Ensure population lives in satisfactory hygiene and sanitation conditions

- Improve household latrine coverage & use of UDDT
- Enhance health and hygiene promotion

WASH continued

- Promote community centred WASH interventions through scaling up the piloted community-based management model by contextualizing it to fit well in the context of each refugee camp.
- Implement new innovations in sanitation programming including the conversion of waste to energy/resources as a way of ensuring sustainable sanitation.

WASH: resilience and inclusion

- Sector plan links with CRRF and GoE pledges regarding basic and social services and is integrated within overall development environment: SDG 6, National Plans and UNDAF
- 2. Assisting host communities Itang water utility provides for refugee and host community. Host community has access to other camp water supply systems.
- Building national capacity- supporting the implementation of Utility model including capacity building
