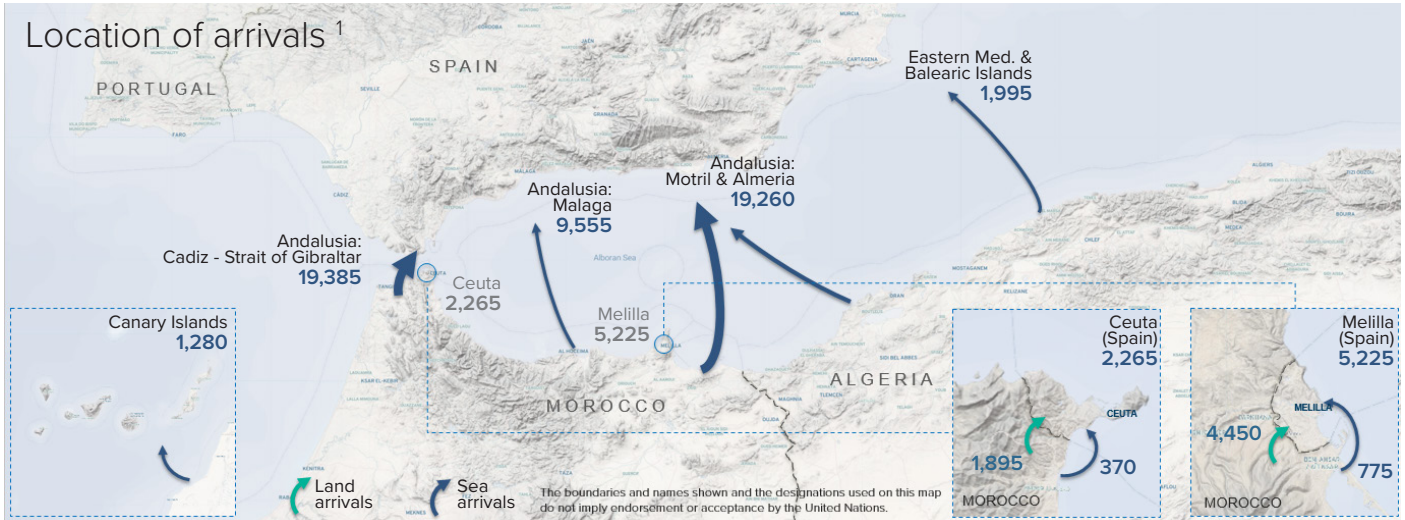

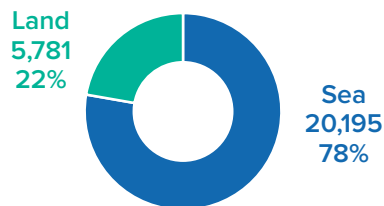

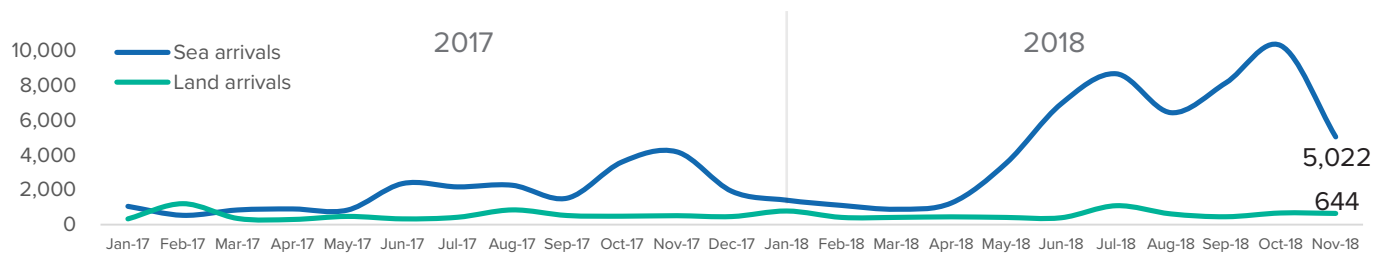

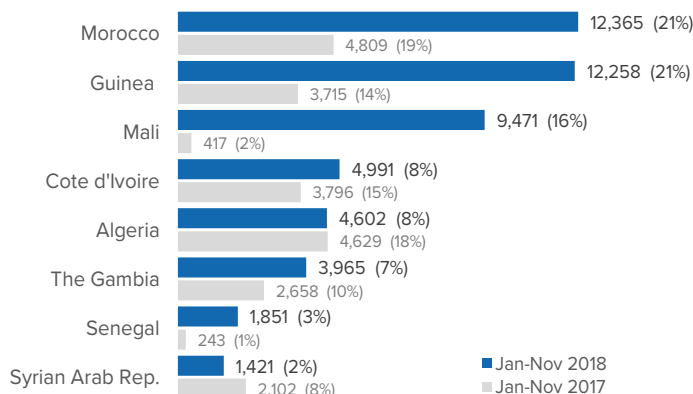

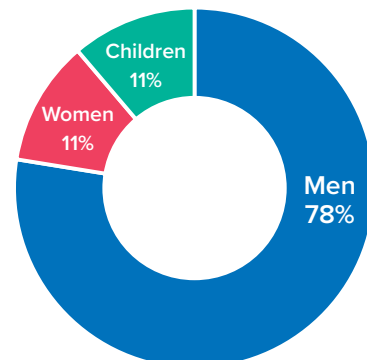
Arrivals trend by month

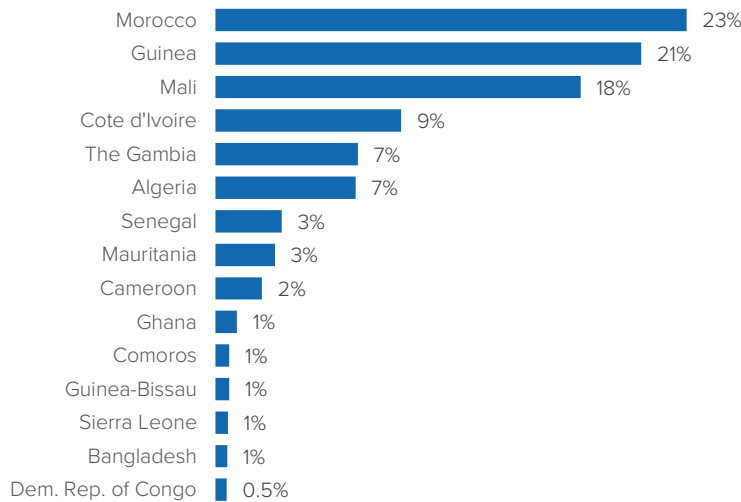

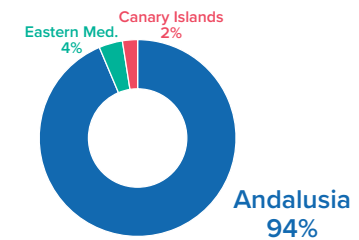

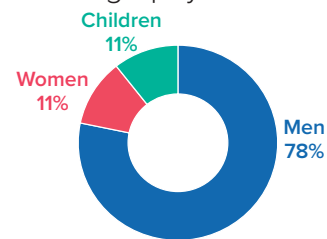

Arrivals by region

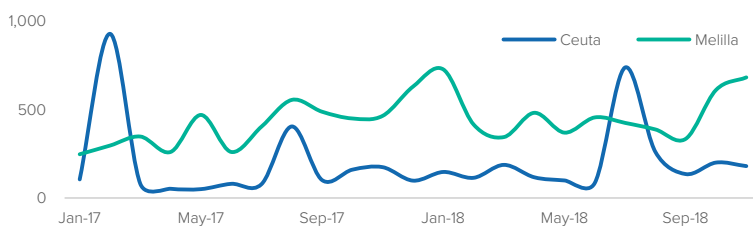

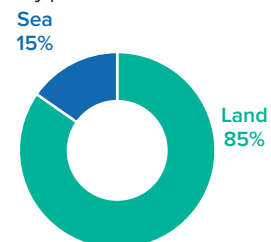

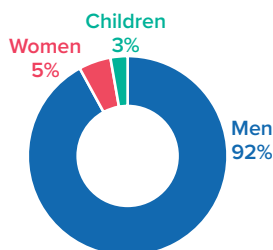

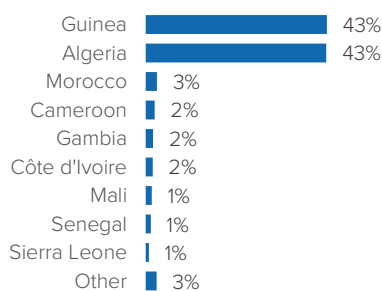

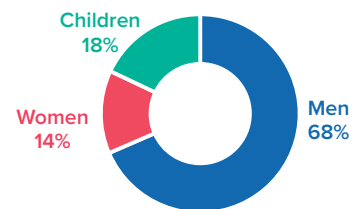
