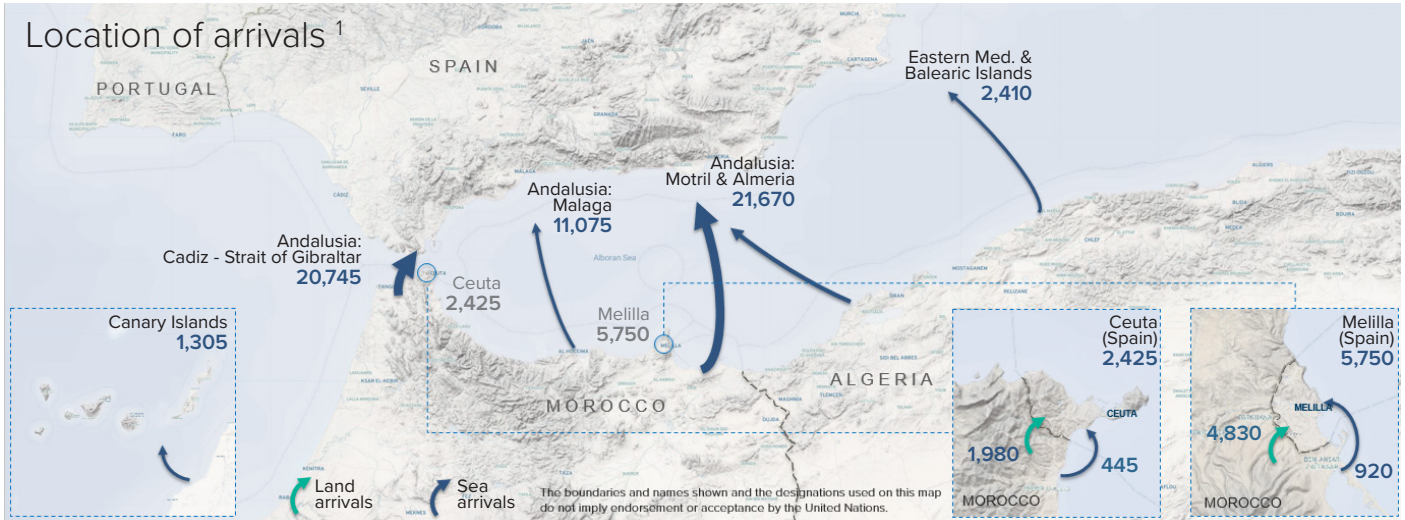

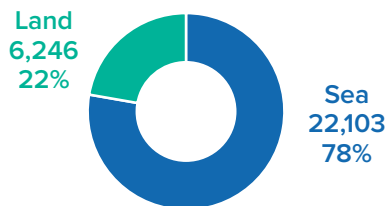
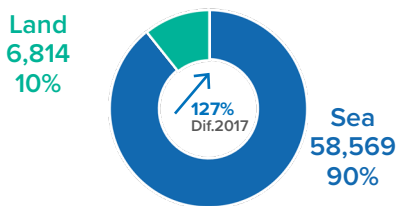

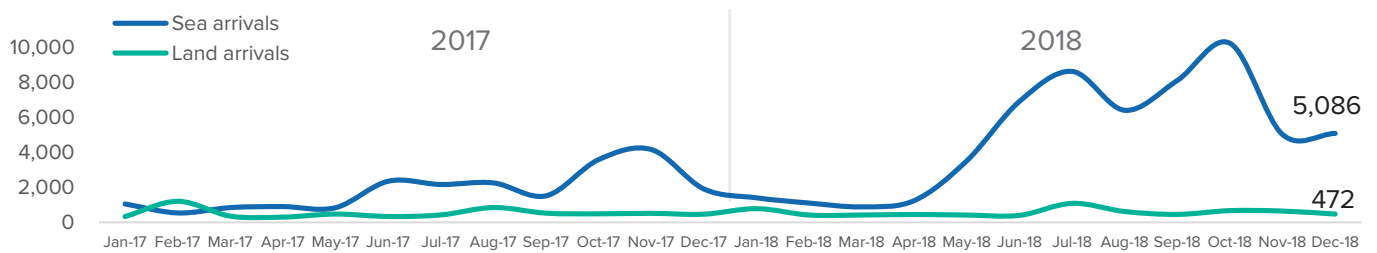

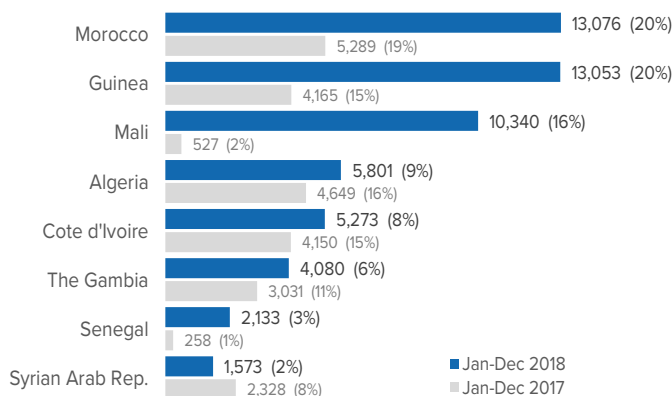

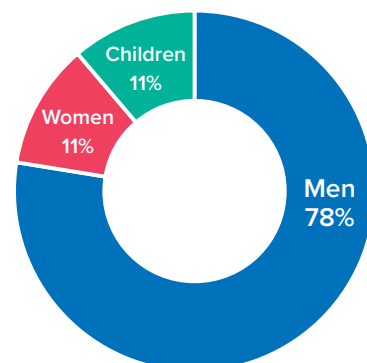
Arrivals trend by month

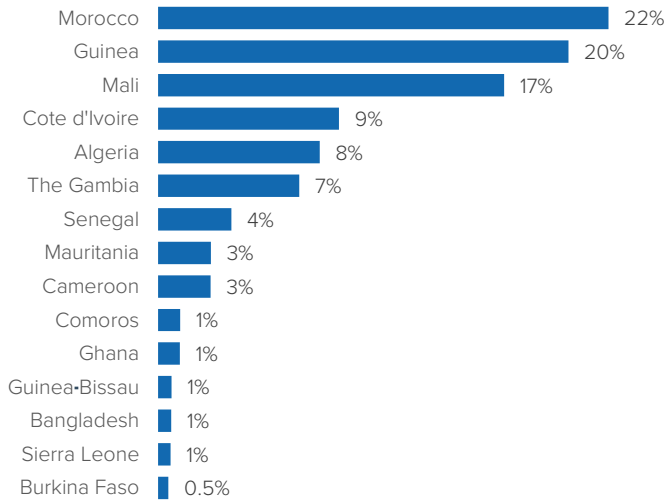

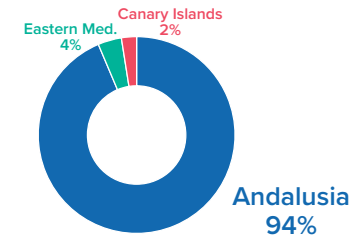

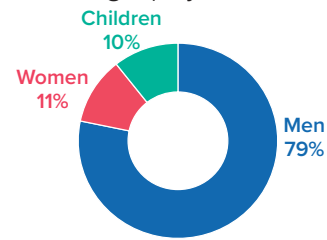

Arrivals by region

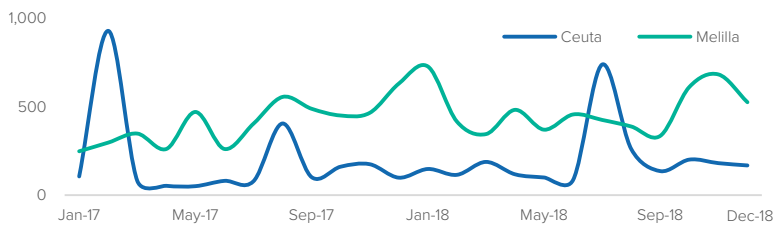

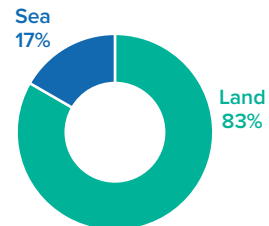

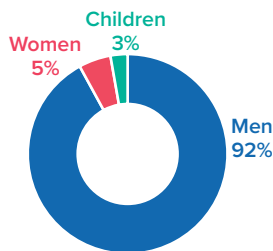
Arrivals trend by month



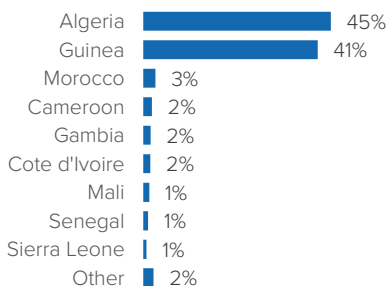

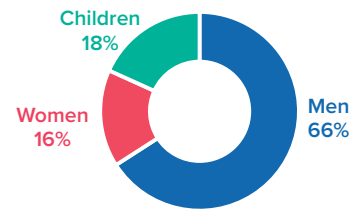

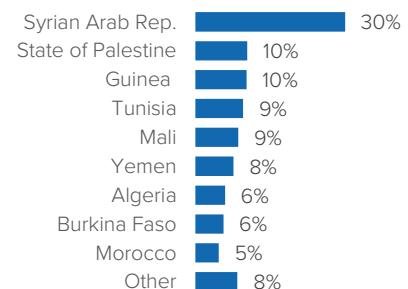
Most common nationalities
