



POPULATION DISTRIBUTION






AGE-GENDER BREAKDOWN<sup>3</sup>




SCHOOL-AGED CHILDREN (6-17 YRS)<sup>3</sup>




REPRODUCTIVE-AGED WOMEN/GIRLS (13-49 YRS)<sup>3</sup>






AGE-GENDER BREAKDOWN<sup>3</sup>




SCHOOL-AGED CHILDREN (6-17 YRS)<sup>3</sup>




REPRODUCTIVE-AGED WOMEN/GIRLS (13-49 YRS)<sup>3</sup>






POPULATION DISTRIBUTION






AGE-GENDER BREAKDOWN<sup>3</sup>




SCHOOL- AGED CHILDREN (6-17 YRS)<sup>3</sup>




REPRODUCTIVE- AGED WOMEN/GIRLS (13-49 YRS)<sup>3</sup>




AGE-GENDER BREAKDOWN<sup>3</sup>




SCHOOL-AGED CHILDREN (6-17 YRS)<sup>3</sup>




REPRODUCTIVE-AGED WOMEN/GIRLS (13-49 YRS)<sup>3</sup>




**AGE-GENDER BREAKDOWN<sup>3</sup>**




**SCHOOL- AGED CHILDREN (6-17 YRS)<sup>3</sup>**




