Presentation of Second Chance Schools	Ms. Despoina Patrikiou, a principal for the Second Chance School (SDE) of Stavroupoli, presented the education opportunities that are available for refugees within SDE. SDE are formal education institutions that are addressed to adults who did not complete their basic education. The length of study is two years (18 months), while lessons are scheduled for 25 hours per week. The diploma awarded for the completion of SDE is equivalent to that of Gymnasium. The special characteristics of SDE are that they are adaptable to the educational needs of adults, and offer individualized exams; they are usually staffed with psychologists and professional guidance counsellors. While new registrations are only accommodated until October 15th, most SDE with vacant places can accept registrations after that deadline. There are also evening SDE (16:30-20:15), and do not require a certification that students are employed (evening EPAL do). In order to register to SDE, one must have a primary school diploma —certain SDE bypass that and register students without this documentation. There are SDE in: • Center (Ethnikis Amynis 2) • Strebenioti area • Delta area • Pylaia area • Pylaia area • Evosmos (Dendropotamos) area • Lagkadas All education/accommodation actors are encouraged to consider SDE for their adult beneficiaries, due to the individualized support that they offer. 	All actors were called upon to share their comments once more and declare if they would like to co-sign. One week after the meeting, Arsis was to submit the letter to the MoE, with INTERSOS' and RTI's signatures.	
	UNHCR noted that letters addressing the government need to be signed by legal entities (e.g. NGOs) and not unofficial bodies such as the sub-national WG.	
	The comment was made that, for joint advocacy efforts to proceed, different actors have different reaction times, based especially on the flexibility of their advocacy departments.	
	It was noted by OMNES that upon trying to register one teenager to EPAL, they were instructed by the regional directorate of education to register to GEL instead.	
Presentation of Diadrasis early	YMCA presented its "Diadrasis" center, which operates with OSF/MDAT funding. The center has two zones:	
childhood center (YMCA)	In the morning zone, pre-registered Arabic-speaking children between the ages of 2-4 receive Greek/Arabic early childhood education.	
	 In the afternoon zone, Diadrasis opens its doors to Greek, Arabic, Farsi, and Turkish-speaking children belonging to the 2-3,5 year-old or 4-6 year-old age group. Different activities are planned each week, while on Fridays the center is open for the whole family.

Presentation of Hellenic-Arabic Friendship program in Open Schools	The Hellenic-Arabic Friendship organization (situated in Olympou 14), has expanded its non-formal education program to include classes in the Intercultural school of Xirokrini. More specifically, the following program runs once a week in the school, and 4 times a week in their spaces: • Greek, English and German classes • Arabic for native speakers • Arabic for non-native speakers	Please contact baderac@gmail.com for further information.
	The Open Schools program operates under Niarchos foundation funding, and is run by the Municipality of Thessaloniki (Directorate of Education and Sports) in collaboration with Creativity Platform. The program started in June 2018 and will end in March –pending updates on renewal.	
Updates from partners	SolidarityNow will continue its non-formal education program into 2019 through DG-HOME and IOM funding, in Volvi, Serres, Drama, Kavala, and Kato Milia. The urban Thessaloniki education program in Blue Refugee Center, Intercultural School, and Lab 29A continues as well, for children 6-18. Adult classes are also held in BRC.
