





SITUATION OVERVIEW

Over 741,000 Rohingya refugees have fled violence from Myanmar's Rakhine state since August 2017 and are hosted in Bangladesh. Most of the refugees rely on humanitarian assistance, having left with few possessions and exhausted their financial resources during the journey.



More than 910,000 Rohingya refugee women, men, girls and boys are hosted in Cox's Bazar District, including 34,172 registered refugees who arrived in the 1990s (4%); and other unregistered Rohingya refugees who had settled in host communities prior to August 2017. Children make up 55% of the total refugee population and women and girls make up 52%. One in three refugee families have at least one easily identifiable protection vulnerability. Whilst the pace of arrivals has decreased, refugees continue to arrive in Bangladesh, as of end of May 2019.

The dashboard monitor the monthly achievements of selected indicators from the 2019 country operation plan for each strategic area of activity with cumulative key figures and monthly highlights.




GEOGRAPHIC SITUATION



ACHIEVEMENT (MAY 2019)


- 878** WASH facilities constructed in this reporting month, including **304** water taps and **574** latrines.
- 4,066** WASH facilities maintained in this reporting month, including **2,629** tubes well and **1,437** latrines.
- 449** waste bins and waste pits installed in this reporting month.


SHELTER

KEY FIGURES

- 16** kilometers of roads and pathways, **22** kilometers of drainage, **13** kilometers of retaining structures, **10** kilometers of steps and **0.9** kilometers of bridges constructed
- 81,308** pre-monsoon shelter tie-down kits distributed
- 86,126** * shelter padlocks provided


PROGRESS AGAINST 2019 TARGETS

ACHIEVEMENT (MAY 2019)

- 23.3** kilometers of infrastructures constructed during this reporting month, including **8.7** km of roads and pathways, **0.2** km of bridges, **1** km of steps, **4** km of retaining structures, and **9** km of drainages.
- 770** shelter repair and replacement assistance provided while **28** transitional shelters were constructed in this reporting month.
- 36,487** pre-monsoon shelter tie-down kits and **113** shelter padlocks distributed in this reporting month.


ENVIRONMENT & ENERGY
KEY FIGURES

- 17,804** host community households have been visited during LPG distribution assessment
- 46** conflicts with elephants successfully mitigated by trained ERT* members
- 3,087** refugees received environmental education

PROGRESS AGAINST 2019 TARGETS

ACHIEVEMENT (MAY 2019)

- 649** households received LPG cylinder while LPG refills were distributed to **67,737** families in this reporting month.
- 606** host community households received LPG cylinder while **5,588** host community households were visited during LPG distribution assessment in this reporting month.
- 505** refugees received environmental education in this reporting month.


NFI & SITE MANAGEMENT
KEY FIGURES

- 16** camps managed by site management support agency partners
- 63,179** female/menstrual hygiene kits distributed

PROGRESS AGAINST 2019 TARGETS

ACHIEVEMENT (MAY 2019)

- 33** households received core relief items during this reporting month.
- 42,404** female menstrual hygiene kits distributed to women age 12 to 59 year old during this reporting month.

- 2,028** host community households are continuing their livelihood intervention with TUP* projects
- 2,861** host community and **500** refugee households are continuing their livelihood interventions
- 573** host community and refugee households enrolled for skill development training for ensuring their self-reliance

PROGRESS AGAINST 2019 TARGETS

ACHIEVEMENT (MAY 2019)

- 1** peaceful coexistence project completed during this reporting month.
- 2,861** host community households initiated their livelihood interventions while **2,028** are continuing their livelihood intervention with TUP projects in this reporting month.
- 46** host community and **134** refugee households enrolled for skill development training for ensuring their self-reliance in this reporting month.
