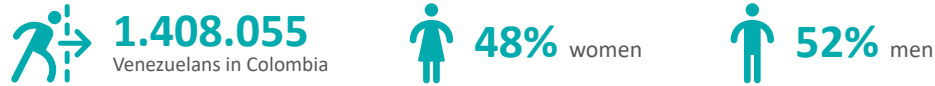


# Venezuelan Refugees and Migrants

June 2019

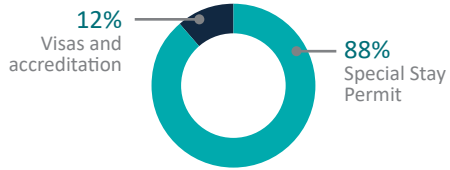
Colombia and Venezuela share a land border of 2,219 km, along which there are 7 official border crossing points and an undetermined number of informal crossings. Since 2015, the situation in Venezuela has caused an increase in the arrival of Venezuelan refugees and migrants to Colombia.

**665.665** irregular



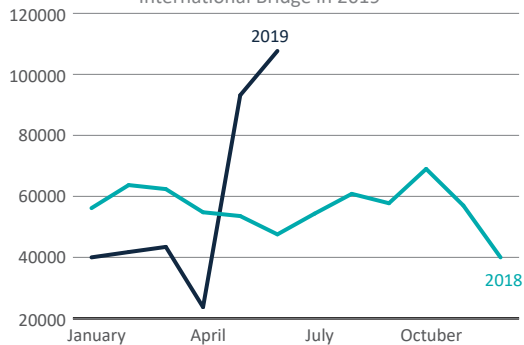
## Venezuelans in transit<sup>b</sup>
