JRP has had two main components: Refugee and Resilience. The new proposed structure in JPRP 2020-20220 includes Resilience, Protection as well as Impact Assessment. Resilience: Covers the infrastructural needs. Protection: Includes the following interventions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Preparing studies and assessments ➤ Awareness Programs ➤ Documentation and legal support ➤ Training, rehabilitation, etc. JRPP 2020 – 2022 shall be built on a comprehensive vulnerability assessment. Incorporation of Protection, Environment, Gender and Age Markers under umbrella of SDGs.
