



UNHCR SYRIA SITUATION REPORT FOR THE NORTH EAST SYRIA HUMANITARIAN EMERGENCY

Emergency response update



Protection concerns and response

- UNHCR's protection partners continue conducting needs assessments in collective shelters, identifying persons with specific needs and delivering protection services to IDPs both in collective shelters and host communities. To date, protection needs assessments have been completed in 49 collective shelters: Hassakeh (30), Mabada (4), Malkieh (3), Qamishli (1), Tal Hamis (2), Tal Tamer (8) and Raqqa (1). Rapid needs assessment conducted in 11 neighborhoods hosting new displaced population: Malkieh (2) and Raqqa (9) and its rural areas. Main protection concerns and needs remain as previously reported as lack of privacy and overcrowding becoming the top issue in all collective shelters.
- A total of 8,705 individuals staying in 50 collective shelters in Hassakeh, Tal Tamer, Tal Hamis, Qamishli, Malikieh were reached by UNHCR protection partners with different protection activities, including recreational activities for children, GBV prevention sessions, PSEA session, PSS, case management and general/medical in-kind assistance for persons with special protection needs. Protection partners continue to reach the IDPs in host communities with different protection services.





NFI and shelter response


- As of 31 October UNHCR reached some 126,200 individuals with core and winter NFIs in the collective shelters and host communities as well as in the camps.
- Winter distributions are ongoing and have already reached over 60,000 people or twothirds of the population in Al Hol, Areesha, Ein Issa before it closed, Roj and Mahmoudli camps.
- NFI distributions are ongoing in collective shelters and host community to IDPs in Hassakeh, Mabada and Qamishli and Tal Tamer. As of 31 October nearly 62,000 individuals in 119 sites have received assistance, including over 7,316 children with specific winter clothing kits. It is estimated that UNHCR has 63 per cent of those displaced across 112 locations of Hassakeh, Malikeyeh and Qamishli sub-districts.
- UNHCR has completed basic shelter repairs in 15 collective shelters benefitting an estimated 689 households, nearly 3,100 individuals; work is ongoing in another 3 shelters for 118 HH and repairs are planned for another 16 collective shelters with 778 families.



Financial Information^{*}

UNHCR is grateful for the critical support provided by donors that have contributed to this operation as well as those that have contributed to UNHCR programmes with broadly earmarked and unearmarked funds.

UNHCR's 2019 total financial requirements for Syria is USD 624.4 million. As of 22 October, only USD 170.6 million has been received; 27 per cent of the total requirements.
