HIGHLIGHTS


As of 31 October, **7,089** registered refugees voluntarily returned to Afghanistan, out of which 5,301 returned from Pakistan, 1,719 from Iran and 69 from other countries.

379,849 individuals have been displaced by conflict in 2019 and profiled by OCHA as internally displaced persons (IDPs) in need of protection and assistance.


A series of briefings took place to raise awareness on the **Global Refugee Forum** and to engage in discussions on how the Government of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan and the international community can contribute to addressing the needs of Afghan refugees and returnees. This included donors, UN organizations and national and international humanitarian agencies and development actors. The UNHCR led (together with NRC) Protection Cluster in Afghanistan finalized inputs for the 2020 Humanitarian Response Plan, with five core objectives; 1) monitoring of key protection issues, 2) provide emergency protection assistance and services, 3) develop community-based protection responses, 4) strengthen the capacity of partners and service providers, 5) mainstream and integrate protection into all sectors and cluster-specific humanitarian responses.









VOLUNTARY REPATRIATION

of refugee returnees who received cash grants in close coordination with MoRR, UNHCR and its partners manage four encashment centers in Herat, Jalalabad, Kabul and Kandahar with services including basic healthcare, malnutrition screening, mine risk education, child friendly spaces, back to school information, legal counselling, SIM card distribution, SGBV awareness raising, and transit accommodation.




HUMANITARIAN-**DEVEVELOPMENT-PEACE NEXUS**





