4: IM Prsentation	 Collaboration continues with all sector partners in accordance with strategic planning of 3RP 2019-2020 and M&E framework. The importance of Activity Info is explained in order to obtain right and accurate dashboard and Updated Livelihood Dashboards are shared with LH partners. Service Advisory designed by UNHCR is introduced to LH partners. This programme shows 4Ws of organizations activities for all sectors. 	-Mid term Livelihood Dashboard and 4Ws will be shared with LH TWG Partners.
4: BN-LH Sector Joint Meeting Outcomes	 BN and LH Sectors discussed the transition from ESSN to sustainable livelihoods opportunities and common messaging. Following meetings will be realized. Social Security Assistant Fund (SSAF) Programme will be implemented to the refugees who couldn't benefited from ESSN. WFP has realized a pilot study in Tarsus. Though agricultural workers are excluded from employment quota, WFP still have challenges in the address registrations in agricultural areas. WFP with its intensive advocacy with local authorities in Tarsus for example to register 25% of HHs living there and majority of them have ESSN card.

		in July for 350 Syrian beneficiaries partnering with Harran University-TOMER. Concern	
		Turkey will provide vocational training courses in October funded by UNHCR.	
	٠	Imaar Reconstruction has signed protocol with GCoI to provide training courses for	
		capacity building of construction sector and they are looking for funding for their new	
		project ideas related to construction.	
	•	ACTED has Turkish language courses partnering with UNHCR in Mersin. They provide job	
		counselling for 25 beneficiaries with respect to registration for job placement.	
	•	IOM is ready to implement in kind grant activities due to the completion of market	
	-	assessment. Inflation is a challenge for job placement activities currently. EoI for the	
		selection of IP for the IOM Entrepreneurship Training grant was shared with LH	
		partners.	
	•	UNHCR arranged a contact meeting which will take place in Gaziantep Chamber of	
		Commerce (GCoC) for the entrepreneur Syrian refugees registrated by GCoC with the	
		attendance of government authorities (MoLSSF, DGMM)	
	•	RIZK Professional Development is registered officially by İŞKUR for job placement	
		activities in İstanbul, Urfa and Gaziantep.	
	•	UNDP implements job creation component of MADAD in Kilis, Urfa, Hatay, İzmir and	
		Adana provinces, municipal component of MADAD in Hatay, G.Antep and Urfa and ISKUR	
		capacity enhancement project in İstanbul, Hatay, G.Antep ,Kilis with different donors.	
		Waste transfer station will be established in Urfa and Hatay, capacity of GMM will be	
		enhanced via forming PMO offices in G.Antep, Hatay, and Ş.Urfa provinces.	
	•	ASAM is working with international organization and UN women on vocational training	
	•	course, protection and social activities. Furthermore they plan to open kitchen and	
		textile workshop in Public Education Center at the end of September.	
	•	ILO has running livelihood projects with GESOB, GCoI and Gaziantep Vocational Training	
		Center related to vocational training and basic life skills courses. GESOB provides	
		technical assistance for job placement by arranging consultants for Syrian refugees who	
		seek jobs and try to start up business. SADA center, ASAM and UN women will arrange 3	
		workshops for textile, kitchen, packaging and shoe sectors. ILO will organize social	

	 security and occupational seminars during first and second week of September in GESOB as well. TRC has 14 community centers, 2 of which are located in Istanbul. They also provide vocational training courses (hairdressing, sewing etc.). Certification is provided after success exams as informed. CARE has Cash for Training activity on shoemaking sector for 400 beneficiaries in Hatay. It is informed that they will provide Turkish language and vocational training courses in G.Antep, Kilis and Urfa at the beginning of October 2018. YUVA provides cash for training courses which will start in 4-5 weeks in the provinces of istanbul, G. Antep and Mersin. FAO provide vocational training courses on agriculture and also have complementary language and life skills courses. An increasement has seen on employment of 35% when comparing with last year 25% at agriculture sector. Self reliance for SuTP and vulnerable host community members is aimed with the collaboration of livelihood sector by developing a joint work plan. DRC has activities in 5 provinces Mersin, K.Maraş, Urfa, Kilis and Hatay. Turkish and English language continues with YUVA Organization. They provide in kind assistance and have business development center in Hatay. Next month DRC will conduct a job fair in
	cooperation with different partners. DRC plans to create an online platform to buy products as well but there are challenges about outreach registration during the
	 IYOM has ToT activities for the adaptation of Syrians gaining highly integrative life skills via HR companies. They also interact with İŞKUR and Universities in order to prevent duplication of their activities.
	WFP arranged a workshop with government authorities related to ESSN Programme.
6: Any Other Business	 Syrians work informally in the agriculture sector and most live in tent. On the other hand they benefit from ESSN which is a challenging issue for WFP and government authorities.
