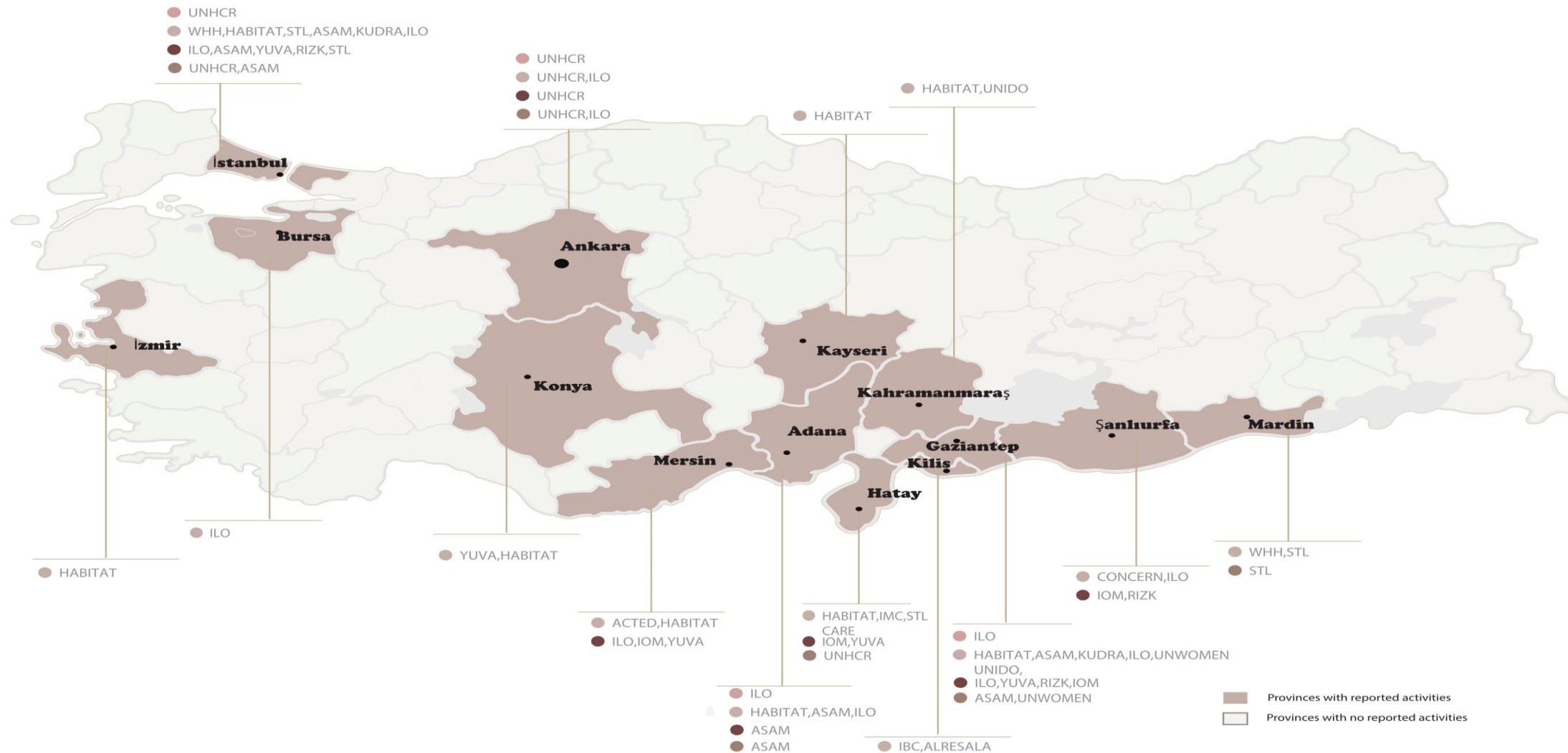

TURKEY LIVELIHOOD SECTOR | Who does What Where When on Livelihoods Activities Jan-September 2018

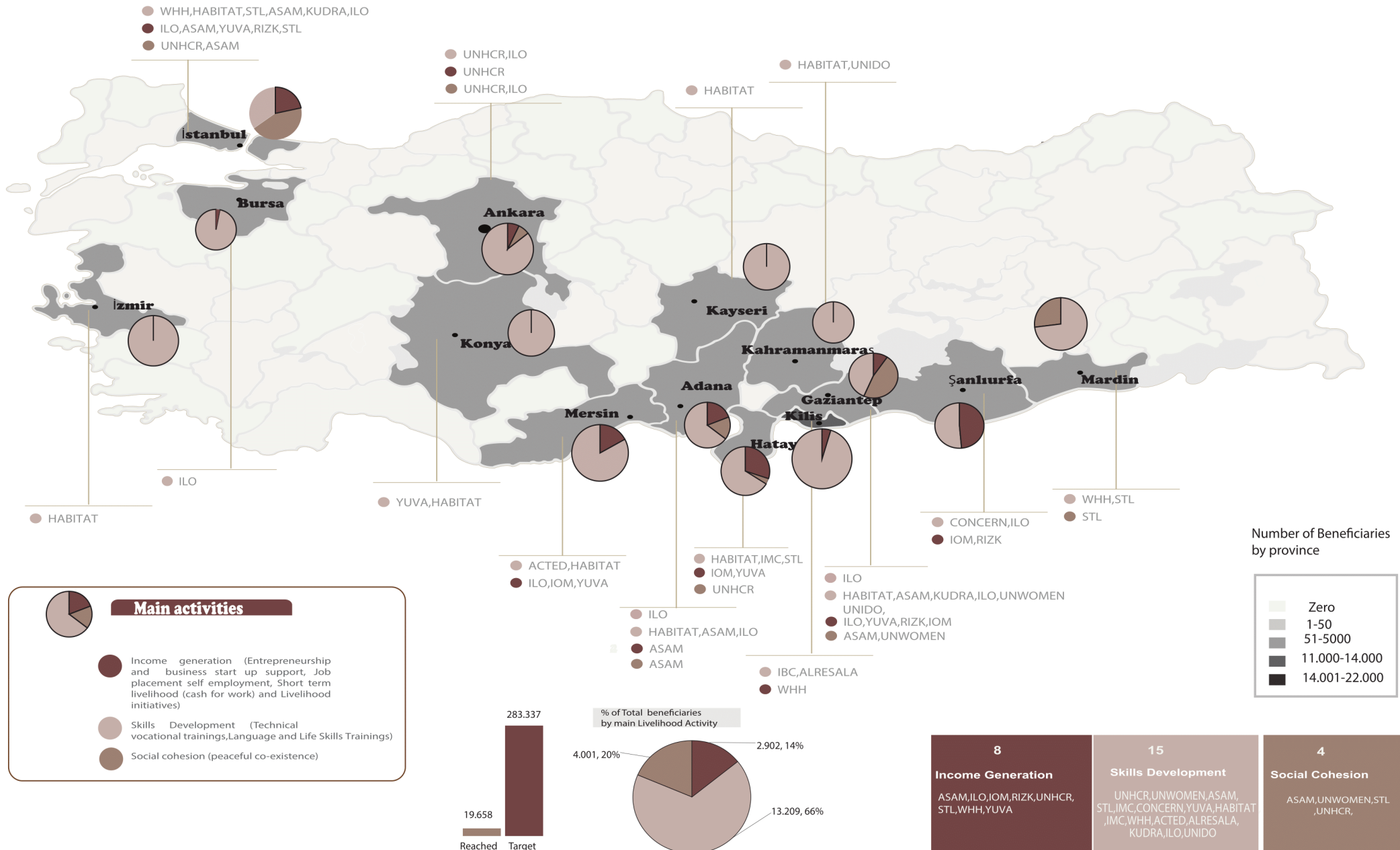

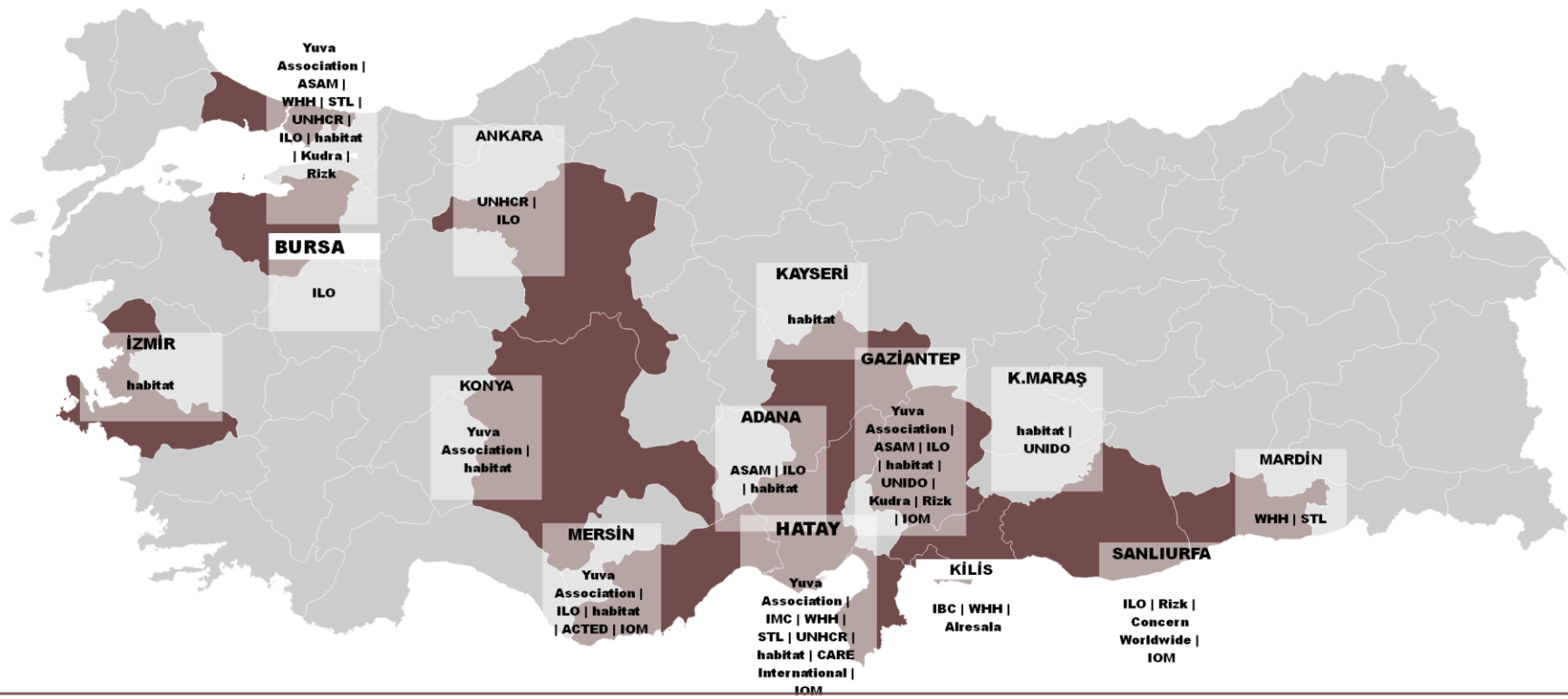


Turkey Livelihoods Sector (January-September 2018)

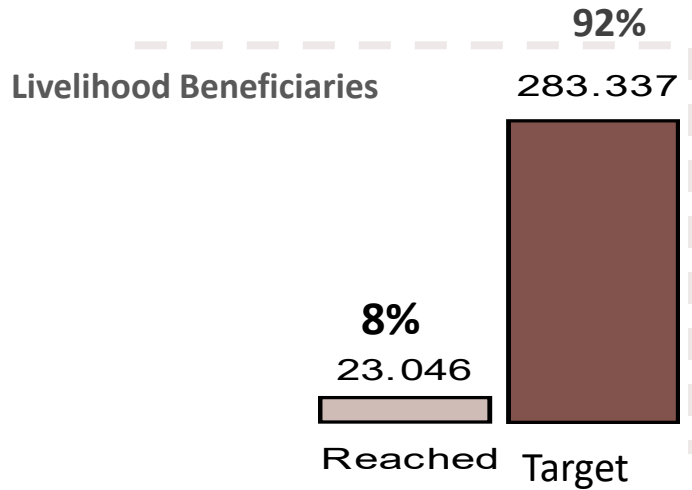
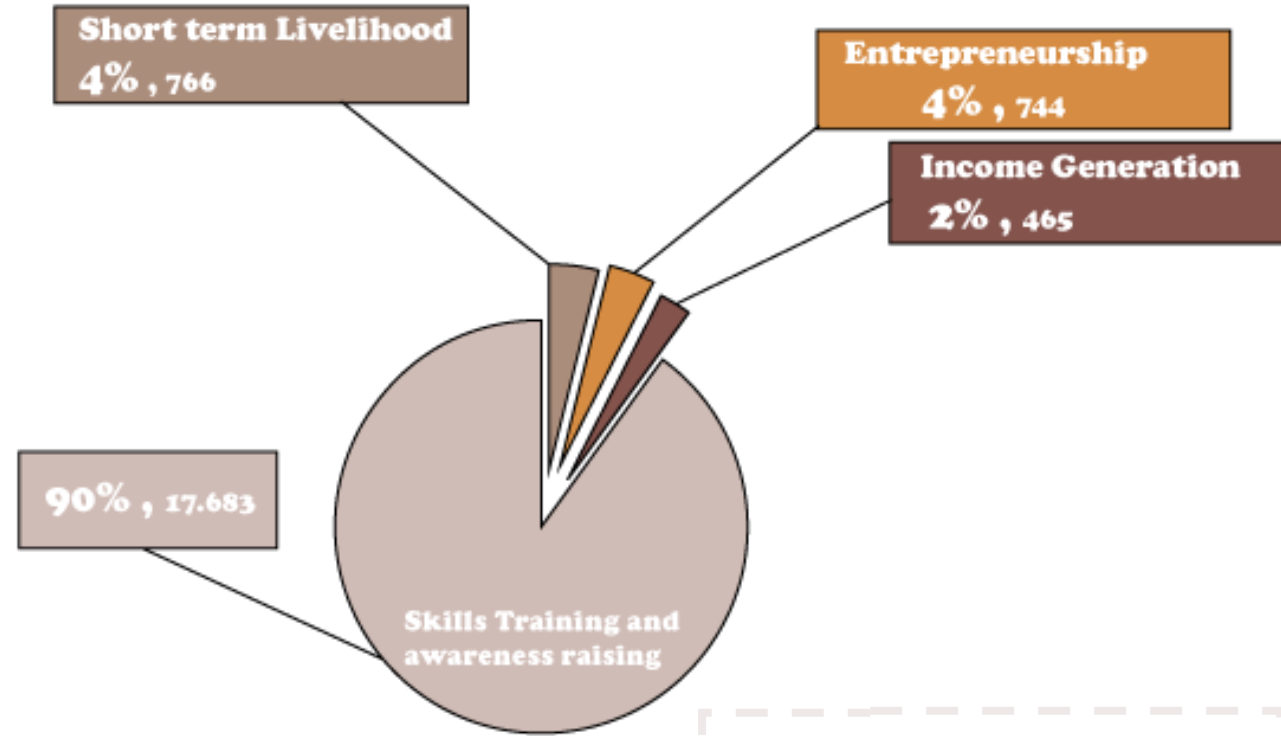

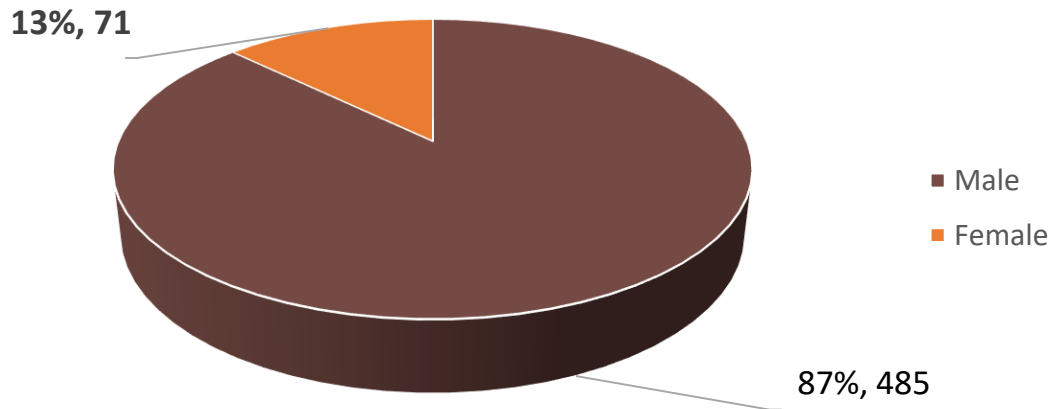
