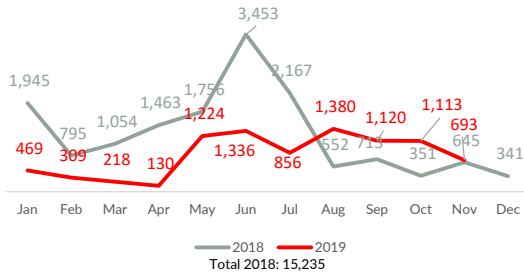


Libya continues to be a transit point for departure from North Africa towards Europe. UNHCR's interventions at disembarkation points in Libya focus on the provision of life-saving assistance and protection monitoring, to identify persons in need of international protection, as well as vulnerable individuals, such as unaccompanied and separated children, elderly, medical cases, women at risk or victims of trafficking. UNHCR through its partner International Medical Corps provides medical services and core relief items. In addition, UNHCR rehabilitated WASH facilities at six disembarkation points, in Azzawya, Tripoli (3), Tajoura (Al Hamidiyah) and Alkhums.

As of 30 November 2019, the Libyan Coast Guard rescued/intercepted a total of 8,848 people in different locations along the Libyan coast. Over the same period last year, the LCG rescued/intercepted a total of 14,894 refugees and migrants at sea. So far in 2019, Libyan local authorities have recovered 18 bodies of people who perished while attempting to cross the Mediterranean towards Europe, while 327 people were reported missing.

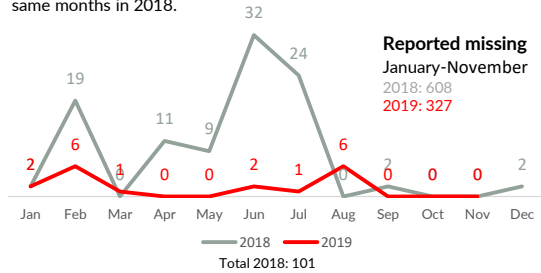
Monthly trends - people rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard in 2018-2019

From January to November 2019, 8,848 people were rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard, a decrease of 40.6% compared to the same period in 2018.

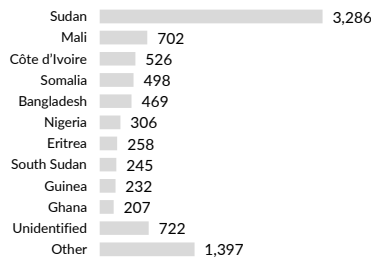


Monthly trends - recorded loss of life in Libyan waters in 2018-2019

From January to November 2019, 18 dead bodies were recovered in Libyan waters, compared to 99 over the same period in 2018. In addition, 327 people were reported missing, compared to 608 in the same months in 2018.

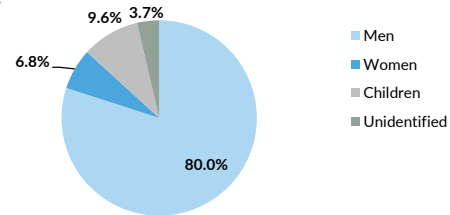


Nationalities rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard in 2019

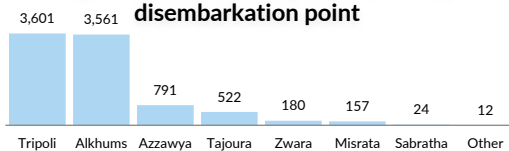


People rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard in 2019 by group

Of the total of 8,848 people rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard, 7,076 were men, 602 women, 847 children and 323 unidentified.

As of 30 November 2019, UNHCR, through its partner International Medical Corps, provided medical assistance to 1,086 people and distributed 5,071 hygiene kits at disembarkation points.
