

Somalia

1 - 29 February 2020

In February, 37,000 new internal displacements were monitored by the UNHCR-led Protection and Returns Monitoring Network (PRMN). Drivers include conflict and insecurity (25,000), drought-related (11,000), and other reasons (1,000).

In Galgaduud region, more than 17,000 people were reported fleeing due to armed conflict between Al Sunna Wa Jamma and Somali National Army. New displacements also continue from Lower Shabelle to Banadir (4,000 in the month).

35,499
refugees & asylum-seekers

As of the reporting month, there were 35,499 refugees and asylum-seekers registered in Somalia, mainly from Ethiopia (17,354 asylum seekers and 4,227 refugees) and Yemen (45 asylum seekers and 13,249 refugees). 624 persons were from other countries including Syria (268), Tanzania (122), Eritrea (103) among others.

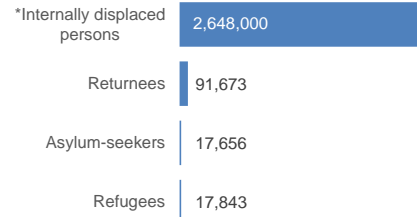

refugee returnees (2014 - 2020)

Since December 2014, 91,673 Somali refugees have voluntarily returned to Somalia with UNHCR assistance from different countries of asylum including Kenya, Yemen, Djibouti, Libya, Sudan and Eritrea. In addition, some 38,559 Somalis were monitored as arriving from Yemen since March 2015.

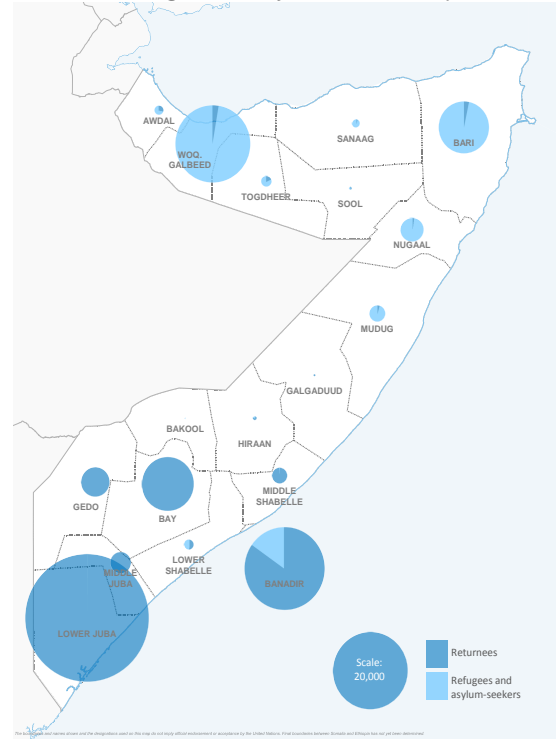

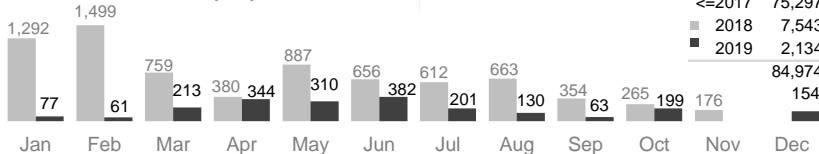

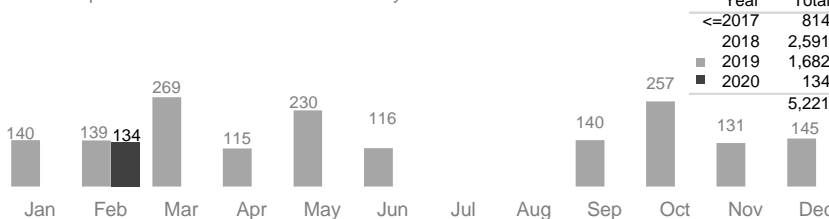
Returnees, refugee and asylum seekers map



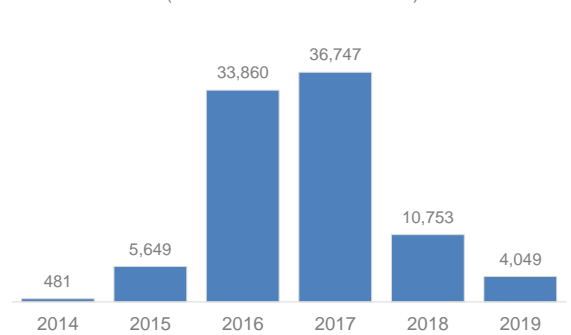
Somali returnees from Kenya by month

Number of returnees (with assistance from UNHCR) since 2014



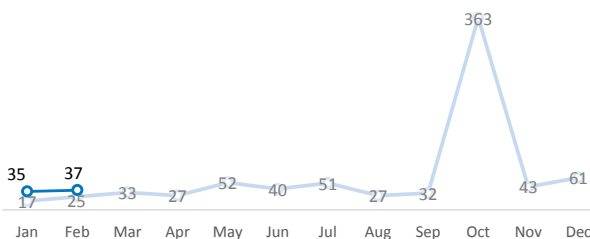

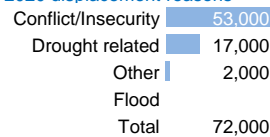

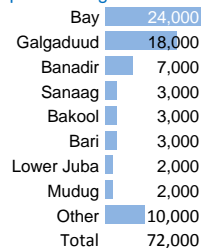

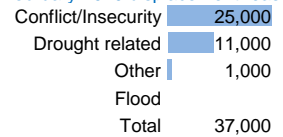
2020 displacement reasons



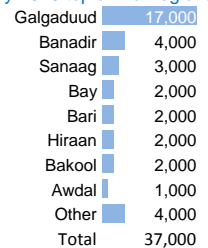
2020 top arrival regions



February 2020 displacement reasons

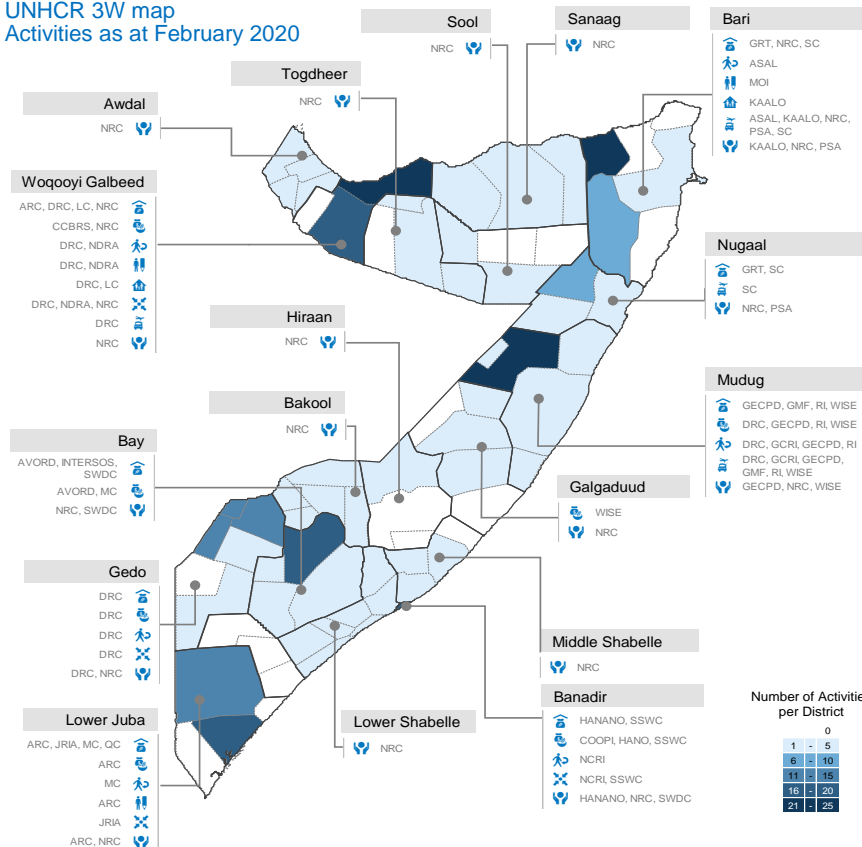

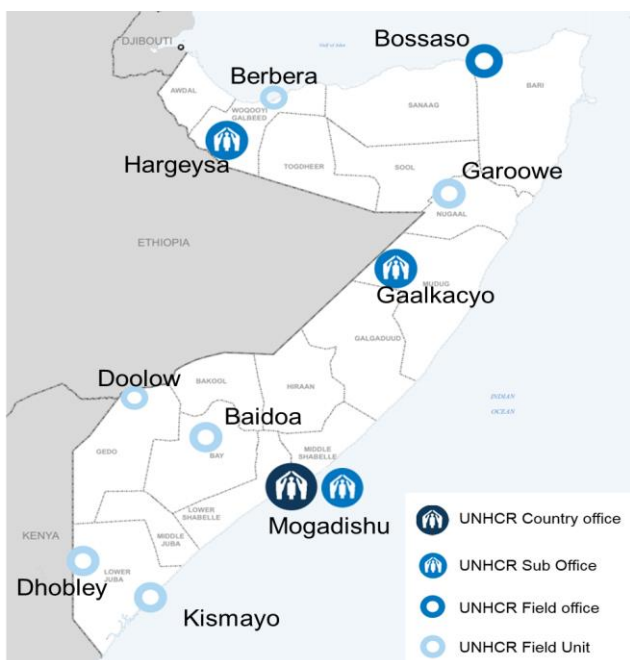

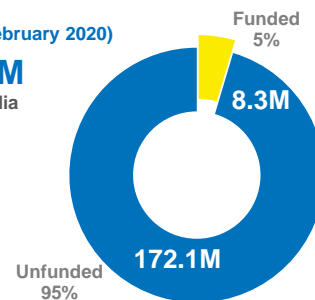
