



DAILY UPDATE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE-19

As of 30 March 2020, no new countries registered COVID-19. WHO reported confirmed COVID-19 cases, 693 224 (58 411 new) cases and 33 106 (3215 new) deaths, CFR 4.8%.

Below is the surveillance update of travellers from countries/areas/territories as at 00.00hrs 30 March 2020.

NB: Songwe and Mbirima borders screened all travellers and non were from high risk countries. We trying to migrate to district based reporting on follows. The data displays may change.






Figure 1: Cumulative people on follow-up for COVID-19 surveillance for Malawi, 30 March 2020

Laboratory testing

Currently we have three laboratories that are testing for COVID-19, National Health Reference Laboratory (NHRL), College of Medicine (COM) Laboratory and Malawi Liverpool Welcome Trust (MLW). Table 2 shows the test counts for each laboratory.

In the past 24 hours, our laboratories received 2 samples that are yet to be tested making the cumulative number of samples 37to date, 18 were tested and were all negative for COVID-19.
