# Market update, 1st-14th July 2020

Because the COVID-19 pandemic and the mitigation measures put in place to minimize the spread and transmission of the disease may disrupt the functioning of markets in Uganda, WFP increased the coverage and data collection frequency of its market monitoring system to better inform decision making.

For markets in Karamoja and the rest of the country, prices of key national staples including maize, beans, and sorghum are monitored. In Karamoja, the price of goats is also monitored. For refugee settlement markets, the price of the food commodities that constitute the WFP General Food Assistance (GFA) food basket (maize grain, beans, vegetable oil and salt) are monitored and the price of the GFA food basket is compared with the GFA cash transfer value to gauge the purchasing power of refugees that receive the GFA as cash.

## **Key Highlights**

## 1. Refugee Settlement Markets

- Overall, the market price of the GFA food basket decreased by 7 percent from June to the first half of July 2020. In the South
  West and West Nile settlements, the average market price of the food basket decreased by 8 percent and 7 percent respectively
  from June to the first half of July 2020.
- For the first time since February 2020, the WFP transfer value when averaged for all settlements could cover 100 percent of the cost of the GFA food basket in both South West and West Nile settlements.
- The GFA food basket was most expensive in Adjumani, Lobule and Rhino camp refugee settlements where the WFP cash transfer value could only cover 90 percent, 93 percent and 94 percent of the cost of the food basket respectively.
- The average prices of all GFA food basket commodities (maize, beans, vegetable oil, salt) decreased from June to the first half of
  July. Among the GFA food basket commodities, maize grain (11 percent) recorded the highest decrease whereas vegetable oil (1
  percent) recorded the least decrease.

#### 2. Karamoja Markets

- The average price of maize grain decreased by 7 percent from June to the first half of July 2020, after registering a 3 percent
  decline from May to June 2020. Prices are expected to decline further in July as first season harvest starts in most parts of the
  region.
- The average price of beans across all reference markets decreased by 6 percent from June to the first half of 2020, after declining by 9 percent from May to June 2020. The first season harvest of 2020 continues to increase the supply of beans in the market which has caused a decline in the average price of beans, whose prices had consistently increased from January to May 2020.

#### 3. Key Markets in the Rest of the Country

- The average price of maize grain decreased by 11 percent from June to the first half of July 2020 after it had remained stable from April to June 2020.
- The first season harvest has increased the supply of beans in the markets, resulting in a drop in the average price of beans in most reference markets. Overall, the average price of beans further dropped by 4 percent from June to the first half of July 2020 after decreasing 15 percent from May to June 2020.
- In the first half of July 2020, the average price of sorghum decreased by 9 percent from June 2020. Average sorghum prices had remained stable from April to May 2020 and increased by 10 percent from May to June 2020.

## Market Price of the GFA Food Basket in Refugee Settlement Markets

• In all settlements except Kiryandongo and Nakivale, the market price of the food basket in the first half of July was lower than in June 2020. Overall, the market price of the GFA food basket decreased by 7 percent from UGX 20,746 in June to UGX 19,276 in the first half of July 2020 (



- Figure 1).
- The WFP transfer value could on average cover 100 percent of the cost of the GFA food basket in all settlements in the first half of July 2020. The situation has continued to improve since June 2020 compared to April and May 2020 when the cash transfer value could not cover the entire cost of the food basket cost.
- The cost of the food basket decreased by 9 percent in the first half of July 2020 compared to March 2020 when transport restrictions were implemented to contain the spread of COVID-19.
- Regional differences in the price cost of the food basket were observed. In South West settlements, the average market price of
  the food basket decreased by 8 percent from UGX 17,373 in June to UGX 15,954 in the first half of July 2020. The market price of
  the food basket in South West settlements<sup>1</sup> has remained below the WFP transfer value from March 2020.
- In West Nile settlements, the average market price of the GFA food basket decreased by 8 percent from UGX 22,855 in June to UGX 21,353 in the first half of July 2020 below the WFP transfer value. In West Nile settlements<sup>2</sup>, the market price had remained above the WFP transfer value from March to June 2020.
- Except in Adjumani, Lobule, Rhino Camp, Kiryandongo and Palabek settlements, the WFP cash transfer value was enough to meet the cost of the food basket in all the other refugee settlements in the country. In the first half of July 2020, the GFA food basket was most expensive in Adjumani (UGX 24,509), Lobule (UGX 23,718) and Rhino camp (UGX 23,314). In these settlements, the WFP cash transfer value could only cover 90 percent, 93 percent and 94 percent of the cost of the food basket respectively.
- For the current reference period, the food basket was least expensive in Rwamwanja (UGX 15,166), Kyangwali (UGX 15,621), and Kyaka II (UGX 15,684) settlements.
- The difference between the market price of the food basket in the most expensive market (Adjumani) and the least expensive market (Rwamwanja) in the first half of July 2020 was UGX 9,343, representing about 42 percent of the WFP cash transfer value.




Figure 1: Market price of the GFA food basket in refugee settlements



## **Price Trend of GFA Food Basket Commodities in Refugee Settlement Markets**

- Average maize grain price across all the settlements decreased by 11 percent from June (UGX 1,142/kg) to the first half of July 2020 (UGX 1,015/kg), after remaining stable between April and May 2020 (Figure 2). The first season harvest of maize grain in some areas has increased the availability of maize grain in the market and consequently led to a price decline.
- In almost all settlements, the average price of maize grain in the first half of July 2020 was lower than that of July 2019. average maize grain in the first half of July 2020 was 23 percent lower than that of July 2019.
- The average price of beans decreased by 5 percent from June (UGX 3,186) to the first half of July 2020 (UGX 3,036), after registering a 12 percent decline from May to June 2020. Imvepi and Lobule settlement markets experienced the largest decrease in the average price of beans from June to the first half of July 2020 (31 and 15 percent respectively). The first season harvest of beans continued to cause a decline in the average price of beans in the refugee settlement markets.
- The average price of beans across all settlements in the first half of July 2020 was marginally higher than that of July 2019 by 1 percent. However, in Lobule, Imvepi, Kiryandongo and Bidibidi settlement markets, the average price of beans in the first half of July 2020 was substantially higher than that of July 2019 by 38 percent, 20 percent, 17 percent and 14 percent respectively.
- The average monthly prices of vegetable oil remained stable from June (UGX 5,790) to the first half of July 2020 (UGX 5,758). The average price of salt decreased by 3 percent June to the first half of July 2020, after registering a 10 percent decline from May to June 2020 (Figure 2). The average price of salt increased suddenly and significantly in March, registering a peak in May 2020 and then started declining.

## **Price Trend of Key Staples in Karamoja Markets**





Figure 3: Average prices of key commodities in Karamoja

- Across all reference markets, the average price of maize grain decreased by 7 percent from UGX 1,174/kg in June to UGX 1,087/kg in the first half of July 2020, after registering a 3 percent decline from May to June 2020 (Figure 3). The average price of maize grain is expected to continue to decline as supply from the first season harvest in most parts of the country increases.
- The average price of maize grain across all reference markets in the first half of July 2020 was lower than that of July 2019 by 19 percent. In Kotido and Kaabong, the average price of maize in the first half of July 2020 was lower than that of July 2019 by 42 percent and 33 percent respectively.
- From June to the first half of July 2020 the average price of sorghum across reference markets decreased by 9 percent and was 28 percent lower than that of July 2019. The average price of sorghum grain had remained stable from March to June 2020.
- From June to the first half of July 2020, the price of beans reduced by 6 percent after declining by 9 percent from May to June 2020. The first season harvest of 2020 continues to cause a decline in the average price of beans, whose price had consistently



increased from January to May 2020. In all reference markets, the average price of beans in the first half of July 2020 was either lower or equal to that of June 2020. However, compared to July 2019, the average price of beans was 5 percent higher.

# Price Trend of Key Staples in Key Markets in the Rest of the Country


- The average price of maize grain remained stable from April to June 2020 and experienced an 11 percent decrease from June to the first half of July 2020 (
- Figure 4). The average price of maize grain in the first half of July 2020 was 31 percent lower than that of July 2019. The price of maize grain is expected to decline in July as the first season harvest starts in most parts of the country.
- In the first half of July 2020, the average price of sorghum decreased by 9 percent compared to June 2020. Average sorghum prices had remained stable from April to May 2020 and increased by 10 percent from May to June 2020.
- Overall, the average price of beans dropped by 4 percent from UGX 3,680 in June to UGX 3,518 in the first half of July 2020, after registering a 15 percent decline from May to June 2020. A significant decline in the price of beans was observed in Gulu (17 percent) and Masindi (13 percent). The first season harvest continues to increase the supply of beans resulting in a reduction in the average price of beans. The average price of beans in the first half of July 2020 was higher than that of July 2019 by 11 percent.
